TEEN SEXUALITY

Dr. Lynn Ponton is a San Francisco psychoanalyst and renowned adolescent psychologist who has spent more than 20 years talking directly to teens about their school, family and sex lives. Lynn Ponton, MD, is a professor of child and adolescent psychiatry at UCSF and author of "The Romance of Risk: Why Teenagers Do the Things They Do" and "The Sex Lives of Teenagers: Revealing the Secret World of Adolescent Boys and Girls." She is also the mother of two teenage girls.

Barbara Huberman is an expert consultant on adolescent pregnancy prevention and sexual education and has been working in the field for over 30 years. She is currently the National Director of Education and Outreach Education for Advocates for Youth based in Washington, D.C. In 1996, she was chosen to be a founding board member of the National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy and was the first Chair of the National Task Force on State and Local Action (1996-1998). Barbara was the founder of "Let's Talk Month", a public education campaign each October to help parents talk to their kids about sex and "Teen Pregnancy Prevention Month" in May. Barbara has recently completed a curriculum for the workplace on sexuality and parent-child communication.

Estelle Raboni is a graduate of Columbia University and the Manager of Education and Special Projects of Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA). She is the co-creator and writer of "Sex Matters: Teaching Healthy Sexuality," an interactive multimedia game for teens and sexuality educators on the Planned Parenthood website for teens, <u>www.teenwire.com</u>. She is also the Editor-in-Chief of the national, award-winning publication for sexuality educators and trainers, *Educator's Update*, and creator and editor of the electronic news service, *What's New in Sexuality Education?*

Suzanne Witzenburg is Director of Education and Outreach for Planned Parenthood Hudson Peconic (PPHP) serving Westchester, Rockland, Putnam and Suffolk counties, and heads a team of nine educators. In her 12 years with Planned Parenthood, she and her staff have trained over 300 peer educators and organized 12 Teen Health Conferences attended annually by over 800 teens and professionals. Suzanne received the Golden APPLE Award for excellence in leadership by the Association of Planned Parenthood Leaders in Education last year. In 2001 she was selected to participate in a study tour in The Netherlands, Germany and France on adolescent sexual behavior and attitudes. Suzanne is the mother of two grown sons.

Amy Schalet is a PhD candidate in Sociology at the University of California at Berkeley (BA Harvard University, 1992). She has conducted over 130 in-depth interviews with American and Dutch teens and their parents, a project that will culminate in her dissertation "Raging Hormones, Regulated Love: Adolescent Sexuality and the Constitution of the Modern Individual in the US and the Netherlands." She has published her research widely in English and Dutch and is frequently invited to speak at national and international conferences.
