Hope, Progress, Answers - the fundamental building blocks of our mission. The nw amateur disc series is a non-profit, grass roots organization dedicated to the mission of battling cancer, enhancing local livability, and promoting the sport of disc golf. The series features three all-amateur disc golf tournaments sanctioned by the Professional Disc Golf Association (PDGA).

- o Battling cancer - 100% of all proceeds benefit cancer research and prevention through the Oregon Cancer Ski Out, a non-profit 501(c)3 organization. For 16 years, the Cancer Ski Out, its board of directors and members, have been dedicated to their mission of providing funds for Cancer research, prevention, and hospice care in the Northwest. Beneficiaries include the Oregon Health Sciences University (OHSU) Cancer Institute, Candlelighters Childhood Cancer Foundation, Willamette Falls Hospice, and other cancer programs.

- o Enhancing local livability - before and after each event, the nw amateur disc series hosts a Stop Oregon Litter and Vandalism clean-up. A key goal of the series is to leave each community better than we found it, every time.
