



## *The Africana Homestead 2004 Poetry Contest*

The Africana Homestead 2004 Poetry Contest is a new event sponsored by Africana Homestead Legacy Publishers (AHLPL). We have established this contest to support emerging, amateur poets in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Delaware, and to honor the legacy of African Americans and recent black immigrants who live in those states.

In each category we will award contest winners a cash prize and a trophy or plaque. Honorable mentions will receive a certificate. We will publish the entries of the winners and those who earn honorable mention in an anthology for release December 1, 2004. AHLPL will also invite first, second, and third place winners to read their work at an awards ceremony in April 2005, which is National Poetry Month. AHLPL and contest entry fees will fund the prizes. Each winner may earn only one major prize. If a winner has more than one submission, they may earn honorable mentions for their other works.

### **2004 Contest Rules**

#### **Categories:**

CHILDREN (under age 12 on June 30, 2004)  
YOUTH (under age 18 on June 30, 2004)  
ADULT (age 18 and older on June 30, 2004)

#### **Prizes:**

CHILDREN First: \$75; Second: \$50; Third: \$25.  
YOUTH First: \$150; Second: \$100; Third: \$75.  
ADULT First \$300; Second: \$200; Third: \$100.

Open to: New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Delaware Residents.

#### **Entry Guidelines:**

1. Poems may be short or long, any type, or style. The subject must be any aspect of the historic or present-day black experience in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, or Delaware. Entries must be the author's original work that is unpublished and not submitted elsewhere for publication or broadcast, not accepted elsewhere for publication or broadcast, and not entered simultaneously in any other competition. This includes previous versions of the poem. Joint authorship is acceptable.
2. Length of each short poem entry must not exceed 30 written lines. This may be one poem or a collection of short poems whose cumulative total is 30 or fewer lines. Length of each long poem entry must not exceed 180 lines. You may submit as many entries as you wish with the appropriate entry fee.
3. You must print all entries single-sided, on plain 8 1/2" x 11" paper. Please do not double space. If your entry is more than one page, please number the pages and put the title of each poem at the top of the pages.
4. Send two copies of each entry. You must also submit one cover sheet with the author's name, address, phone number, and e-mail, and title of each poem in your submission. We will ask the winners to submit their biographical profiles.
5. We will not accept faxed or electronic copies. We will not return your entries.
6. The entry fee is \$10 per submission for adults and \$5 per entry for children and youth. You may pay by check or money order, in United States, payable to Africana Homestead Legacy Publishers.
7. AHLPL will announce the winners in the first week of October 2004 and will post the names of the winners and titles of the winning entries on the AHLPL website, [www.ahlpub.com](http://www.ahlpub.com), by October 31, 2004. AHLPL will notify winners of the contest results by mail.

Criteria: All judging is blind and the decision of the judges is final. They will judge entries on originality and the sense of the craft of poetry shown in the work. Judges will be literary professionals from academia and the publishing industry.

Deadline: Your entry must be postmarked no later than June 30, 2004.
