# Co-Chair, US Commission on National Security for the 21st Century

Since retiring from the US Senate, Gary Hart has been extensively involved in international law and business, as a strategic advisor to major U.S. corporations, as an author and lecturer and as senior counsel to Coudert Brothers, a multinational law firm with offices in 32 cities located in 19 countries. Under his leadership as co-chair of the U.S. Commission on National Security for the 21st Century, the Commission performed the most comprehensive review of national security since 1947, predicted the terrorist attacks on America and proposed a sweeping overhaul of US national security structures and policies for the post-Cold War new century and the age of terrorism. He also co-chaired the Council task force that produced the report: "America Unprepared—America Still at Risk" in October 2002. Hart has been visiting fellow and lecturer at Oxford University, and guest lecturer at Yale University and the University of California. He earned a PhD. degree from Oxford University and graduate law and divinity degrees from Yale University. The author of 14 books, Hart represented the State of Colorado in the US Senate from 1975-1987.

# **Emily Howell Warner**

### **Commercial Airline Captain**

Denver native Emily Howell Warner took her first airplane flight as a teenager and came away from that experience with a passion to fly and become an airplane pilot. In 1973, 67 years after the Wright Flyer made aviation history and 25 years as her first plane flight, Emily also made aviation history by becoming the first women hired as a major airline pilot. Today, with more than 21,000 flight hours (more than any other woman pilot in the world) she is a Federal Aviation Administration aircrew program manager, assigned to United Airlines' Boeing 737 fleet. She is also the FAA representative for United's flight safety action program.
