SureFire, Inc. began 25 years ago as Mims Manufacturing. In the 1980's, Don Mims produced all kinds of wood products for companies in and around Fort Worth, Texas. Among those products was a crude rubber band shooter. Never one satisfied with mediocrity, Don took it upon himself to design and build the

"World's Finest" rubber band shooter. Shortly thereafter, Patent #4949494 was awarded to SureFire, Inc. and with it came the rubber band shot heard 'round the world! SureFire, Inc. now produces the "World's Finest 12 Shot" rubber band shooters, targets and accessories and has built a worldwide audience of hobbyists, users and fans unequaled by any other line of rubber band guns made.

A Short History of Rubber Bands

It is believed that the history of rubber bands began with the ancient Mayans in Central America. The Mayans collected natural rubber tree sap, a sticky latex substance that hardens when exposed to heat. Combining this sap with juice from other native plants, the Mayans developed a latex-like substance that was more durable, elastic and much less brittle than pure rubber. They eventually discovered that this substance was a great way to secure axe heads to wooden handles, waterproof ceramics, and when rolled into a large mass, made a terrific sphere for a game something like soccer--eventually replacing the human heads they had previously used as a "ball" for the game.


By the time of the European conquests, Central American natives were creating all sorts of things from rubber, including bottles and even clothing. British ships took some of these items back to England more as curiosities than treasures. But in 1820, Thomas Hancock realized that variations of rubber would make fabulous elastic straps for gloves, shoes, stockings, and suspenders. In 1839, Charles Goodyear developed and patented *vulcanized* rubber, which proved to last far longer and hold up better under wear and tear than plain rubber.

Then in 1845, Stephen Perry patented the first true rubber band made of vulcanized rubber. Today over half the rubber products in the world are created from synthetic rubber while most rubber bands are still made, at least in part,

from natural materials.

The high quality rubber bands of today, plus exceptional designs and workmanship are what make SureFire, Inc.'s guns simply the best rubber band shooters ever made. This includes the magnificent, 144 shot gear-driven Gatling Gun shown here--a unique, Surefire only product available in kit form or fully assembled.

Do you think the Mayans had something like this in mind when they first began milking rubber trees? Well, probably not, but we certainly owe them gratitude for their contribution to one of the most useful, yet least heralded inventions known to mankind--the lowly rubber band.
