


TRUMPETER INN BED & BREAKFAST FRIDAY HARBOR, WASHINGTON

I f you have ever wanted to enjoy the thrilling and beautiful sight of the majestic orcas (nicknamed "killer whales") feeding and playing in the cold blue ocean waters off the Pacific Northwest, then head to San Juan Island, Washington, via one of the Washington State Ferries. Every year from May through September the waters of Haro Strait on the island's west side are home to about 90 orcas. In the summer, whale watching tours and flights leave regularly from the harbor of the picturesque town of Friday Harbor.

Lime Kiln Point State Park, nicknamed Whale Watch Park and only nine miles from Friday Harbor on West Side Road, offers opportunities galore to observe the resident orcas in their spyhopping (poking the head out of the water to look around) and tail flopping glory. Along with orcas, you are likely to see porpoises, sea lions, minke and gray whales playing in the waters backdropped by the beauty of surrounding islands. Bird watching is also a favorite past time on the island with an abundance of bird species like the Tufted Puffin, Peregrine Falcon and Bald Eagle.

Downtown Friday Harbor is home to the Whale Museum. There you can see, for example, an explanation with diagrams of how whales use echolocation to navigate. Perhaps the most intriguing display is the genealogy of the Southern Resident Community of orcas. Orcas live in small, close-knit, life-long pods. The orcas of the San Juan Islands have been separated into pods J, K and L, (and even into sub pods) with birth dates and affiliations just like a human genealogy tree. Although orcas are often called "killer whales," they are actually dolphins - the largest of the dolphins. (The name "killer whale" evolved from "whale killer," which was originally given to the orcas by sailors who saw them attack and kill whales.) Another

nickname the orcas have acquired is "wolf of the sea" because of their ferociousness when feeding in the wild.

Just 11/2 miles from the ferry landing at Friday Harbor is the beautiful five acre Trumpeter Inn. The Inn is designated as a Backyard Wild Bird Sanctuary for the myriad of colorful birds and Trumpeter swans that nest in the ponds and marshland surrounding the Inn. Come stroll among the flower-filled gardens and be greeted by views of the tranquil waters of False Bay and the magnificent snow-capped Olympic Mountains in the distance. Be charmed by the fish in the Inn's trout pond and the cattle and horses grazing nearby, captivated at the site of foxes roaming in the grassy hillsides, and spellbound by the flight of the eagles and hawks that fly overhead.

Contemporary art, rich textured furnisings and fresh flowers abound in this six bedroom inn. Each room has lovely pastoral views, cozy down comforters, luxurious linens, Egyptian cotton towels, and plush guest robes. There are three queen-size suites and two king-size suites each with a fireplace and spacious private deck. A wheelchair accessible suite is also available with twin beds. Guests can enjoy a television room equipped with satellite, TV/VCR, and an extensive film library. An open kitchen for around-theclock coffee or tea service and snacking on fresh baked sweets is available.

The inn's private massage studio offers soothing and rejuvenating private massages and facials. Slip into the luxurious robes and slippers you'll find in each room, enter the softly lit massage studio where you'll be greeted by the sounds of soothing music and dancing candlelight, and begin your journey towards total wellness of your body and spirit. Following your massage, consider taking a long, restful nap or soaking in the warmth of the garden hot tub - you will truly believe you have reached the ultimate state of nirvana! Different types of massage, including Swedish and Hot Stone Massage, are offered at the inn by the islands' most experienced licensed massage therapists.

Relatively new innkeepers, Cheryl and Larry Hoppe began operating the



Trumpeter Inn on October 18th, 2005. Previous to purchasing the Trumpeter Inn, they lived in Spokane, Washington where Larry worked as a metallurgical engineer for Kaiser Aluminum.
