Henry Professor of Science and Theology at Southern Seminary in Louisville where he heads its Center for Theology and Science. He is also a senior fellow with Discovery Institute’s Center for Science and Culture in Seattle and the executive director of the

International Society for Complexity, Information, and Design. Previously he was on the faculty of Baylor University where he headed the first intelligent design think-tank at a major research university: The Michael Polanyi Center.

Dr. Dembski has published articles in mathematics, philosophy, and theology journals and is the author/editor of more than ten books. He has taught at institutions such as Northwestern University, the University of Notre Dame, and has held National Science Foundation graduate and postdoctoral fellowships.
