

## Hubert Burda Media to Implement K4 Publishing System Across the Group

Burda opts for innovative technology based on Adobe InDesign and Adobe InCopy

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Hubert Burda Media has made a strategic decision to implement SoftCare's K4 Publishing System with Adobe InDesign and InCopy across all its magazine properties in Germany. Within the next three years, all 68 titles produced by publishers belonging to the Burda group will replace QuarkXPress and Quark Publishing System (QPS) with K4. Ultimately, more than 1,200 Burda employees will be working with the K4 Publishing System.

Choosing a workflow-based solution to control production enables Burda to seamlessly integrate the system into the existing infrastructure, as well as to ensure secure and fast production throughout its editorial offices. With K4, Burda has opted for a modern and innovative editorial system with open interfaces.
