Services

Allsup's professionals help the disabled throughout the entire complex process of applying for and securing their Social Security Disability Insurance benefit. This includes representing them at any of the four levels of the Social Security Administration's review and award system for disability.

Allsup's claim representatives understand the special financial situations of the disabled as well as the physical and sometimes psychological limitations these individuals may have, and is capable of accommodating these needs to ensure customers claims are as thorough as possible and that the disabled win their Social Security Disability Insurance benefits as soon as possible. This includes an Allsup-created approach for securing on-the-record award decisions that allow administrative law judges in some instances to make a determination from a legal brief rather than through an oral hearing, which is often difficult for individual claimants to participate in due to their disabilities.
