

NORTH ISLAND ITINERARY

Day 01 Auckland – Paihia Via the West Coast (L/D)

This morning you will board your luxury tour coach at your CBD hotel and travel north to the seaside township of Paihia. Today's journey will have you travelling via the West Coast region including Opononi.

On arrival into the Puhoi area, a stop will be made at the "Art of Cheese" – which is a family owned and operated cheese factory. The Art of Cheese factory produces 7 different blue cheeses, Camenbert, Brie, Mascarpone and Creme Fraiche. Blue cheese is the specialty and the following varieties are produced: Bohemien Blue, Gorgonzola, Blue Brie and the latest creation is "Kaipara Blue, which is a mild, very creamy blue vein. Here you will enjoy a home-style morning tea including coffee/tea and muffins, before enjoying a short tour of the property including cheese tasting.

You will then reboard the luxury coach and continue the journey north, turning towards the West coast at Brynderwyn. At Matakohe, you will visit the Kauri Museum, before continuing the journey towards the Hokianga harbour via Dargaville & the Waipoua Forest.

On arrival at the village of Omapere you will enjoy a home-style 2 course luncheon at the Copthorne Hokianga Hotel, which has a lovely lawn area that overlooks the sea.

After lunch you will depart Omapere and travel to Paihia via the township of Kaikohe.

On arrival into Paihia, you will be transferred to the **Paihia Beach Resort** for check-in.

In the early evening the group will take a short stroll to the Maritime Building at the Paihia wharf. Here you will board a small water taxi, which will transfer you across to the town of Russell. On arrival at Russell, the group will make its way to the Kamakura Restaurant; here you will enjoy a 3 course set menu style dinner, before returning to Paihia wharf by water taxi.

Day 01 Auckland – Paihia Via the West Coast (L/D) – continued

The natural beauty of the Bay of Islands has to be seen to be believed. It's an aquatic playground lavishly furnished with 144 islands and a myriad of secluded beaches. Every bay, shore and cove has a story to tell. The townships of this historic bay are alive with memories of the area's colourful history. Visitors are welcome to explore the well-preserved relics of the past, both Maori and European. You'll find out why the Bay of Islands is considered to be the birthplace of New Zealand as a bi-cultural nation. You'll also see how Maori culture and lifestyle have adapted to modern times. Wherever you are in the Bay of Islands, it's impossible to escape the lure of the sea. There are almost endless opportunities for immersing yourself in the blue-green world of island and beach.

Day 02 Bay of Islands (B/D)

Upon waking you have the choice of a full continental or cooked buffet breakfast at the hotel restaurant.

Today you are able to participate in one of the many optional tours such as:

- Cape Brett hole in the Rock cruise
- Swim with the Dolphins Cruise
- Cape Brett hole in the Rock by speed boat
- 4 1/2 Day Guided kayak tour (4hours)
- ½ Day tour of Kerikeri, featuring entrance to the Mission House and Stone Store Historic buildings.

The afternoon is at your own leisure, until collection time for the inclusive afternoon tour.

Late in the afternoon the group will be transferred to the Waitangi Treaty Grounds by the luxury coach. Here you will enjoy a privately guided tour of the Grounds, explaining the significance of the area to both the Maori and European people of New Zealand. After the tour, the group will be transferred to tonight's dinner venue – the Sugar Boat restaurant to enjoy a 3 course set menu style dinner.

The Sugar Boat restaurant has a varied and interesting history. Initially starting life as one of six "Lighters" built in 1890 by the Chelsea Sugar factory in Auckland. The Lighters were used to transport up to 200 tons of Sugar from an isolated Birkenhead township to the Auckland city wharves, for distribution throughout New Zealand. From around 1955 the vessel became a House boat for artists and potters for the next 15years, it rested on mudflats near the port of Opua. In the 1970's, the boat was used as a museum of shipwrecks, sitting at the base of the Waitangi Bridge, and remained a museum until 2002.

Day 02 Bay of Islands (B/D) – continued

Today the Tui (the name of the vessel) has been recreated into The Sugar Boat, a stylish cocktail bar and restaurant. The open air bar on top deck is a perfect place to begin your evening with an aperitif. The restaurant is a smart, elegant dining room created in the hold of this original sugar lighter. In the dining tables you will find small relics from it's era as a Museum.

The Driver/Guide will return the group to your accommodation at the end of the evening.

Accommodation: Paihia Beach Resort – (1 Bedroom Superior)

Day 03 Bay of Islands – Matakana – Mangatawhiri Valley (B/L/D)

Upon waking you have the choice of a full continental or cooked buffet breakfast at the hotel restaurant.

This morning you will reboard the luxury coach and bid the Bay of islands region farewell. You will travel south on State Highway #1, via the city of Whangarei and the towns of Ruakaka, Waipu, Kaiwaka towards the Matakana wine region.

Once in the Matakana region the group will be taken to Ascension Winery. On arrival you will enjoy wine tasting, followed by a 2 course set menu luncheon.

After lunch you will reboard the luxury tour coach and continue the journey south to today's destination of Mangatawhiri Valley, which is situated around 45 minutes south of Auckland City.

On arrival at Heritage Hotel & Spa Du Vin you will be checked in.

This evening the group will enjoy a welcome glass of NZ wine and canapés on the lawn area. The lawn area is next to the grape vines, and is surrounded by the beautiful vista of the green hills beyond. The group will then move into a private dining room (Vintage Room) to enjoy a 3 course set menu style dinner.

Day 04 Mangatawhiri Valley – Waitomo – Rotorua (B/L/D)

Upon waking you have the choice of a full continental or cooked buffet breakfast at the hotel restaurant.

This morning you will reboard the luxury coach and travel along State Highway #2, to connect with the main State Highway #1, heading south. The journey will have you crossing the Bombay Hills, an area known for its light volcanic soil thus popular for market gardening. Continue through the fertile plains of the Waikato district, renowned for its horse studs and dairy farms, to Waitomo in the King Country.

On arrival into the Waitomo District, a visit is made to the Waitomo Caves, with their fascinating limestone formations, first discovered in the 1800's. In the glow-worm grotto you take a boat ride silently along an underground river beneath a canopy of lights made by the minute larvae on the roof above you. **OR**

Alternative to Waitomo Cave Waitomo Cave Waitomo Cave You will be transported to Ruakuri Cave, where you will enter through the drum entrance down a spiral walkway. A world of mystery and intrigue awaits you. Immerse yourself in the Mana of Ruakuri and discover the spirit that connects the land and people. The guided journey will take you deep into the unknown. Crystal cave tapestries will enthrall you in the Drum Passage and as you descend, follow the rumbling sound of the Hidden Waterfall to the bridge where the glowworms illuminate this eerie world. Gaze in wonder at stalactite straws, flowstone and majestic formations that surround you. Continue into the dark corners of Holden's Cavern where the guide will tell you about the local Maori legends and tapu places. Experience a sense of trepidation as you traverse along the Ghost Walk. Let your imagination take hold and feel the spiritual power of the cave.

You then travel to Crosshills in Kio Kio for lunch at a country home and farm. The homestead blends in well with the surrounding countryside, and the English-style garden is a delight to stroll through.

Finally, travel via the Fitzgerald Glade and over the heavily forested Mamaku Ranges to Rotorua, located in the Bay of Plenty.

On arrival at Novotel Lakeside Hotel, Rotorua you will be checked in.

This evening the group will be transferred to the Pepper's On the Point Lodge, which is surrounded by the sparkling waters of lake Rotorua. Pepper's on the Point Lake Rotorua, is an 80-year-old mansion that has been extensively refurbished to offer Lodge style accommodation and also casual dining. On arrival you will enjoy a welcome glass of NZ wine and canapés, before moving into the conservatory area. Here you will enjoy a 4 course table d'hote style dinner, or if the weather is favourable, you will be able to eat on the terrace. The group will then be transferred back to **Novotel Lakeside Hotel** at the end of the evening.

Day 04 Mangatawhiri Valley – Waitomo – Rotorua (B/L/D) - continued

Rotorua is situated on a volcanic rift which stretches in a 200 km (124 mile) line from White Island, off the coast of the Bay of Plenty, to Lake Taupo and the volcanoes of the Tongariro National Park in the Central Plateau of the North Island. Rotorua is a forestry, farming and light industrial centre. The Maori culture in Rotorua contributes greatly to the attractions of this holiday city, where you can enjoy the culture and entertainment of the true Polynesian people.

Distance:Mangatawhiri Valley – Waitomo, 160kms – 2 ½ hoursDistance:Waitomo – Rotorua, 166kms – 2 ¾ hours

Accommodation: Novotel Lakeside Hotel – 2 Nights (Lake View Rooms)

Day 05 Rotorua (B/D)

Upon waking you have the choice of a full continental or cooked buffet breakfast at the hotel restaurant.

This morning the group will be transferred from your hotel to the Agrodome complex.

Firstly enjoy an entertaining and educational demonstration on part of New Zealand's primary industry at the Agrodome Sheep Stage show. Sheep shearing and working dogs are included in this one-hour agricultural show. This show lasts approximately 1 hour in duration.

After the Sheep Stage show, the group will experience the Authentic Working Farm Tour at the Agrodome. It is great fun, educational and very entertaining from start to finish! In one hour, you will tour the Agrodome's pure New Zealand farm in all-weather, all terrain vehicles. You will have the opportunity to meet animals of all descriptions, including Romney sheep, beef cattle, red and fallow deer, lamas, alpacas, ostrich and emus. The guided tour shows you all the ins and outs of the 160 hectare farm. Regular stops will be made along the way so that you can have a closer look, plus hand-feed and pet the friendly animals. During the Farm Tour, you will also visit the Pure NZ Organic apple, mandarin orange, olive and kiwi fruit orchard. The group will also stop at the Organic Education Center for kiwifruit wine and honey tasting. 100% pure, 100% New Zealand, not to be missed!

After the tour, you will reboard the luxury coach and be returned to your hotel.

Day 05 Rotorua (B/D) - continued

The afternoon is at your own leisure or you may wish to participate in one of the many optional tours such as:

- Rotorua Sightseeing by Duck
- 4WD ½ Day Excursion to Mt Tarawera
- Location Content of the Polynesian Lake Spa
- 🖊 Kawarau Jet Rotorua speed, spin & adrenalin on a lake
- Full Day Waimangu Round Trip including Morning Tea & Lunch

This evening you will be transferred from your hotel to Te Puia, by your luxury coach.

Then, enjoy a guided tour of the model Maori pa (village site) and close by, the Institute where young Maori are taught the skills of traditional carving. From here, visit the Thermal Reserve to see boiling mud pools and geysers including "Pohutu" ("splashing"), the largest geyser, which plays several times a day.

Later commence your Hangi and Concert.

The ceremony begins with a formal welcome (powhiri), followed by the challenge (wero). You then proceed into the village for the welcoming call followed by a war or haka dance before being welcomed into the meeting house Te Aronui a Rua. After the Speeches of Welcome (whaikorero) enjoy a cultural performance of traditional Maori songs, games and dances by using typical musical instruments and the use of poi and weapons.

At the end of the concert you will be guided into the Hangi house where you will see the lifting of the Hangi (dinner). Well-wrapped food is steam-cooked in baskets in an underground pit. The meal, consisting of wild pork, lamb, seafood and vegetables, is then lifted from the ground and ready for serving.

You are then guided into a typical Marae (sacred courtyard) dining room to enjoy your Hangi dinner whilst being entertained by typical Maori songs. At the end of a wonderful night you will be returned to your hotel by private coach.

Duration: Te Puia Private tour + Hangi & Concert – 4 hours

Accommodation: Novotel Lakeside Hotel – (Lake View Rooms)

Day 06 Rotorua – Taupo - Napier (B/D)

Upon waking you have the choice of a full continental or cooked buffet breakfast at the hotel restaurant.

This morning you depart your hotel for your coach journey to Napier, travelling through plantations of pine forest to Taupo, a township located on the edge of Lake Taupo. The approach from Wairakei offers spectacular views over the town, lake and distant mountains. En route a stop is made to see the pounding Huka Falls, *hukanui* in Maori meaning a "great body of spray". See the waters of the Waikato River forced through a narrow gap between rocks at great force.

Your Driver/Guide will then transfer you to a local jetty on Lake Taupo. Here you will board a private vessel to enjoy a 3 hour cruise on lake Taupo including a home-style lunch.

On return to the Jetty you will reboard the luxury coach and continue the journey to today's destination of Napier. Travel southeast on State Highway 5 to Napier, across the forested pumice land surrounding Napier, across the fertile Esk Valley to Napier.

On arrival into Napier, you will be taken directly to **Scenic Circle Te Pania Hotel** for check-in.

05:00pm In the late afternoon you will reboard the luxury coach to be transferred to the Sileni Wine Estate, here you will enjoy a guided tour along with wine tasting and Olive Oil tasting, followed by a cooking demonstration at the culinary school which is on site, by one of the Restaurant team. He/she will be demonstrating one of the dishes that will be on offer to the group this evening. After the demonstration, the group will be invited to move to the restaurant, where you will be served a 3 course set menu style dinner. At the end of the evening, the Driver/Guide will return the group in the luxury coach to the **Scenic Circle Te Pania Hotel**

Sileni Estate: Sileni Estates is a major vineyard and winery development in Hawke's Bay, New Zealand's oldest established vineyard area. The first vintage was in 1998 and since then the wines have won world wide acclaim. Sileni Estates is named after the Sileni who featured in Roman mythology alongside Bacchus, the god of wine. They celebrated good wine, good food and good company. Sileni estate boasts a state of the art winery designed to crush over 1500 tonnes of grapes. The Winemaking Team has honed their winemaking skills in Alsace, Bordeaux, Burgundy, California and Chile and Oregon & they strive to maintain high standards in environmentally sustainable viticultural and winemaking practices. Sileni Estates produce hand crafted wines that reflect the unique characteristics of the vineyards.

Day 06 Rotorua – Taupo - Napier (B/D) – continued

Napier is the centre of the Hawke's Bay region of New Zealand, Napier is renowned for both its Art Deco architecture and also for its wine industry. Said to be one of the warmest regions in the country with warm summers and mild winters. There are many activities from adventure seeking, wine tasting to just browsing around the local art deco shopping areas.

Full continental or cooked buffet breakfast will be served at the hotel restaurant this morning.

This morning you depart in your luxury coach for your journey to Wellington traveling via Woodville and Masterton.

A stop is made at the Mt Bruce Wildlife Centre for a visit (entrance fee at your own expense). The reserve forms part of the once magnificent Forty Mile Bush. Remaining forest of rimu, rata and kamahi proved ideally suited, initially, for the care of young Takahe and to ensure their survival. The Mount Bruce National Wildlife Centre offers visitors, a unique opportunity to see examples of New Zealand's threatened and endangered wildlife and learn about wildlife conservation.

From Masterton travel south via Carterton and Greytown on State Highway #2 before turning onto highway #53 to the winery town of Martinborough, which is located in the Wairarapa district. The Wairarapa is a well-known area for wine making. Whilst the production from the area may be small, the region has had outstanding international success across a broad range of varietals. Many of New Zealand's finest wines at the ultra-premium end of the market originate from the region.

On arrival at Martinborough, you will stop at Pepper's Martinborough Hotel – here you will enjoy a 2 course set menu style luncheon, in beautiful historic hotel.

Pepper's Martinborough Hotel: Established in 1882. Peppers Martinborough Hotel is a historic retreat offering luxury, boutique accommodation, at the heart of Martinborough Wine Village - one of New Zealand's finest wine destinations. Taking pride of place at the entrance to the square is Peppers Martinborough Hotel. Developer Edmund Buckeridge described it in 1882 as "one of the finest hostelries ever erected in any inland town in New Zealand." A stopping point for prosperous travelers to and from the South Wairarapa's huge isolated sheep a station, its grand façade has been a focal point for the town right from the early days.

Day 07 Napier – Martinborough – Wellington (B/L) - continued

After lunch the group will visit local wineries for wine tasting, before continuing onto Wellington.

You will reboard the luxury coach and return along Highway #53, to rejoin State Highway #2. The luxury coach will then climb the Rimutaka Ranges and travel through the mountain pass descending through the Lower and Upper Hutt Valleys to Wellington.

On arrival in Wellington you will be taken directly to the **Duxton Hotel** with the remainder of the day at leisure.

Wellington, the capital city of New Zealand lies at the southern end of the North Island. On the shores of a magnificent harbour and surrounded by the rugged beauty of green hills, it is one of the most scenic cities. Some of the best views are obtained from the hilltops especially from Mt Victoria lookout. The newest attraction in the "capital" is New Zealand's National Museum. Named "Te Papa" (our place) it contains a wealth of information on New Zealand's past, present and future, many interactive exhibits, multi-media database and fascinating collections. A must see while in Wellington.

Accommodation: Duxton Hotel Wellington (Club Rooms)

Day 08 Wellington (B/L/D)

Upon waking you have the choice of a full continental or cooked buffet breakfast at the hotel restaurant.

This morning the group will explore Wellington's favourite food places in this compact city by foot! Known as New Zealand's café capital, Wellington is ideal for our Zest Walking Gourmet tour. Visit a boutique coffee roaster and café. Enjoy tastings at Wellington's best specialist gourmet food stores. Meet owners, baristas, coffee roasters and chefs. Savour a delicious, light, three course tasting lunch with matched New Zealand wines at a top Wellington restaurant or café. On the completion of their morning walking tour, the group will return to their hotel

The afternoon is at your leisure, and you may wish to do one of the following optional activities:

- Red Rock Seals 4WD Excursion
- Tour of Karori Wildlife Sanctuary 2 hour duration
- 4 Parliament building & Te Papa Museum guided tour

In the early evening the group will reboard the luxury coach, to travel the short distance to tonight's dinner location. On arrival guests will enjoy a glass of NZ wine and a selection of delicious canapés. The group will then sit down to enjoy a sumptuous 3 course set menu style dinner. The Driver/Guide will return the group to your accommodation. 3 glasses of NZ wine per person is included this evening.

Accommodation: Duxton Hotel Wellington

Day 09 Wellington - Tongariro (B/L/D)

Upon waking you have the choice of a full continental or cooked buffet breakfast at the hotel restaurant.

This morning you depart Wellington by luxury coach and travel north via the scenic Kapiti Coast, an idyllic stretch of coastline along the west coast. Then turn inland and travel through rolling farmland to reach the Central Plateau and the Tongariro National Park, which is dominated by Mount Ruapehu, Ngauruhoe and Tongariro. Today's lunch stop will be a quaint chalet about 30 minutes drive out of the town of Taihape; The River Valley Lodge, which is an adventure lodge. Here the group will enjoy a buffet style luncheon, before continuing onto today's destination of the Tongariro National Park and your accommodation the **Bayview Chateau Tongariro**.

A 3 course set menu style dinner will be served in your luxurious hotel restaurant this evening.

Distance: Wellington - Tongariro, 379kms – 6 ½ hours Accommodation: Bayview Chateau Tongariro – 1 Night (Run of House)

Day 10 Tongariro – Taupo – Cambridge – Auckland (B/L/D)

Upon waking you have the choice of a full continental or cooked buffet breakfast at the hotel restaurant.

This morning you will depart the Tongariro National park, and travel though the towns of Taupo, Tokoroa, Putaruru, Tirau (which is known for it's variety of antique stores) and then Cambridge.

On arrival into Cambridge, you stop at the GPO restaurant, to enjoy a 2 course luncheon, which will comprise of "Tapa towers" and dessert platters. There will be time after lunch for the guests to take a stroll around the township of Cambridge.

The GPO stands proudly in the centre of Cambridge and has a very colourful history dating back to 1906 when King Edward VII was on the throne. It was purpose built as Cambridge's new Cambridge Post Office complete with town clock tower. In 1936 when Edward VIII abdicated to marry Mrs Wallis Simpson, it was extended with the grill put over the archway. A clock originally took pride of place on the 53ft high tower but unfortunately during the 1931 earthquake it cracked and was re housed three years later in a newly built tower which can be seen in the Jubilee Gardens. The Cambridge Post Office changed its name to NZ Post in 1987. In November 2004, NZ Post moved its premises to Duke Street and the historic building was put up for lease. 12 months later after much research and effort The GPO vision was turned into a reality as the building was lovingly and thoughtfully restored into a sophisticated bar and brassiere now known as the (GPO) Short for the General post Office. The Bar and Restaurant was opened to the public in October 2005 and has been a great success due to the growing population of Cambridge and the more sophisticated and international presence that is now being incorporated into the town.

Day 10 Tongariro – Taupo – Cambridge – Auckland (B/L/D) - continued

- 02:00pm After lunch you will reboard the luxury coach and continue your journey travelling via the city of Hamilton and the towns of Ngaruawahia and Huntly before reaching Auckland the "city of sails". On arrival into Auckland, you will be taken directly to the **The Westin Hotel** for Check-in.
- 06:00pm In the early evening the group will be transferred from the hotel to a well known inner city restaurant the **O'Connell St Bistro**. Here they will enjoy a 3 course set menu style dinner. The Driver/Guide will transfer you in your luxury to the Westin Hotel at the end of the evening.

O'Connell St Bistro is located on the corner of Shortland & O'Connell Streets in central Auckland; O'Connell Street Bistro is a small intimate dining room of twelve tables, created in the theme of a modern European back street bistro, with a cosy & well-stocked bar. In its nine years of operation, it has been recommended by many publications & won the NZ Beef & Lamb Hallmark of Excellence Award many times. The restaurant has also been awarded an Award of Excellence by the prestigious New York wine magazine, Wine Spectator, for the last six years running, and joins only seven other restaurants in New Zealand to be recognized by this award. O'Connell Street Bistro is currently the only restaurant in Auckland city with this award. Most recently, the restaurant was awarded Best Wine List in the 2006 Metro Corbans Restaurant of the Year awards.

Auckland sprawls across the cones, hills, ridges and valleys of an old volcanic field. Bestriding an isthmus, the cities and boroughs of greater Auckland stretch literally from coast to coast and this gives an interesting and natural diversity. Being surrounded by safe and interesting waters, Aucklanders have become a water-oriented people. It is estimated there are more boats here per capita than anywhere else in the world; hence Auckland has been dubbed "The City of Sails". The climate is temperate and well balanced throughout the seasons. This factor, coupled with Auckland's sealevel location, its green pleasantness and relaxed way of life, add up to a favourable environment.

Accommodation: The Westin Hotel – 1 Night (Harbour View ROH Room)

Day 11 Depart Auckland (B)

Full continental breakfast will be served at the hotel restaurant this morning.

You will be transferred from your hotel to the Auckland International Airport, by private limousine service.
