North Carolina opinion poll on climate change

Wilmington, NC – 10/19/07 – NCclimate.org releases results of its public opinion poll on climate change policy in North Carolina.

On October 12-15, NCclimate.org conducted an independent survey of North Carolinians' views on global climate change and the state government response. The telephone poll included a random sample of 803 households and carried a margin error of +/- 4 percent. Almost 3 in 4 respondents say they are concerned about climate change and only 1 in 10, of those concerned, feel the state government is doing enough to address the issue.

Survey questions:

Are you concerned about global climate change and any of its environmental impacts on North Carolina?

- a) Somewhat Concerned 28 percent
- b) Strongly Concerned 44 percent
- c) Not Concerned 23 percent
- d) Unsure 5 percent

Do you believe our state government in Raleigh is doing enough to address the issue?

- a) No 61 percent
- b) Yes 11 percent
- c) Unsure 28 percent

No significant difference was found among groups of self-described Republicans, Democrats and unaffiliated.
