His first solo performance, desperelics, was produced in 2000 at the Gene Frankel Theater in New York, and later at the HBO Workspace in Los Angeles. It lead to a development deal with NBC based on his characters, and a roll in Mike Nichol's What Planet Are Your From? Unequalibrium, his second solo effort (co-written and directed by Robert McCaskill), was produced in 2002 at the Gene Frankel in New York and selected for publication in Best Plays of 2002 and Best Men's Monologues For the Twenty First Century. The show was produced again in LA, where it was nominated for a 2003 Dramalogue Award and lead to a development deal for an hour drama with Brillstein Grey. Lyras and McCaskill also sold an hour drama to FOX in 2005, developing the script with Dawn Parouse The Common Air, Lyras and McCaskill's third (Prison Break). collaboration, was produced in Los Angeles in fall 2007 and ran for five months. The dramedy links 6 characters during an airport delay, due to possible terrorist activity. The Los Angeles Times writes, "Tensile energy and unflagging skill in his well-crafted, mustsee show."
