
Examining income risk factors for people with disabilities

The unemployment rate for people with disabilities is significantly higher than for those with no disabilities.

Unemployment rates




Unemployment rates for people with disabilities and those without continued to climb. The unemployment rate for people with disabilities averaged 13.4 percent for the first quarter 2009, compared to 8.6 percent for people with no disabilities. People with disabilities experienced an unemployment rate 56 percent higher than people with no disabilities in the first quarter of 2009.

The unemployment rate for people with disabilities declined slightly in March 2009, but it remains higher than for those without disabilities.

Unemployment rates




People with disabilities have consistently higher unemployment rates. During the first three months of 2009, the unemployment rate continued to climb for people with no disabilities while the unemployment rate for people with disabilities declined slightly in March.



Social Security Disability Insurance applications increased 20 percent in first quarter 2009 compared to the same period in 2008.



The number of people applying for Social Security Disability Insurance benefits climbed by 17.4 percent from the fourth quarter 2008 to the first quarter 2009. The year ago comparison of SSDI applications, from first quarter 2008 to first quarter 2009, increased by 20.2 percent. SSDI applications are made by people with severe or permanent disabilities who can no longer work.
