### Fact file

- In 1858 the University of London became the first British university to allow students to sit for degrees regardless of where they studied.
- Between 1949-1969 University College of the West Indies awarded University of London degrees.
- Former students and alumni include six Nobel Prize winners, notably Derek Walcott, winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1992, and The Honourable Arthur N. R. Robinson, former President of Trinidad and Tobago.
- Over 4,900 students are studying in the Caribbean for a University of London degree.
- 45,000 students are studying in 180 countries, on more than 100 programmes.

## ■ Fit your lifestyle

You can pace your studies to fit around family and work commitments. You can gain additional support for your studies from local colleges on a full- or part-time basis.

## ■ Fit your location

You can study anywhere and choose to sit your examinations in any region of the world. We have a comprehensive network of examination centres across 180 countries. In the Caribbean region you can sit exams in Trinidad and Tobago, Antigua and Barbuda, the Bahamas, Barbados, Bermuda and Jamaica.

## ■ Fit your finances

Your overall costs will be substantially lower than if you come to London to study full time. Moreover, you do not need to give up your job as the majority of students in the Caribbean continue working while they study.

If you live in Trinidad and Tobago, you can apply for financial assistance through the Government Assistance for Tuition Expenses Programme (GATE) to cover the cost of tuition at local institutions registered with the Accreditation Council of Trinidad and Tobago.

Typical costs to study for a degree through the University of London External System are given below. Please note that if you choose to attend a local college you will pay additional fees to those listed below.

## How do I study?

You may study independently or attend classes on a full-time or part-time basis at a local teaching institution. For all programmes you will be sent an introductory package of study materials including past examination papers, and on many programmes you will have access to online study resources.

You will be assessed mainly by unseen written examinations which you can take locally.

### Entrance requirements

For all programmes you must satisfy both the general entrance requirements as well as the course-specific requirements. Please see the individual prospectuses for full details or visit our website: [www.londonexternal.ac.uk](http://www.londonexternal.ac.uk)

### Undergraduate study

Our Access route and diplomas provide an entrance route to our undergraduate degrees for those who do not meet the entrance requirements. Our general entrance requirements are given in terms of UK GCSE/ GCE 'O' level and 'A' level passes. The local equivalent entrance requirements are:

- The Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examination (CAPE) (equivalent to GCE 'A' levels): full award of 6 units including 2 double-unit courses satisfies the full general entrance requirement for our undergraduate degree programmes.
- The equivalents for GCSE/CGE 'O' levels are: The Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate (grades I, II and III at the General Proficiency level), in and after June 1998 and the Caribbean Secondary Education



Certificate (grades I and II at the General Proficiency level), up to and including January 1998.

The Qualifications for Entrance section in our prospectus lists further qualifications from the West Indies which we also accept.

The deadline for receipt in London of application forms for undergraduate programmes is 17 September 2009, but we recommend that you apply as early as possible for your programme.

For the Diploma in Law you will need to apply direct to an institution which has 'Permission to teach' the programme, and they will have different application deadlines. Please see table on pages 6-7 for information on which institutions in the Caribbean teach for the Diploma in Law.

### Postgraduate study

For entrance requirements for postgraduate courses, please see the relevant individual prospectus. Please note that application deadline dates vary for postgraduate programmes.
