Consensus decision making builds unity and effectiveness in organizations of all kinds. It enables groups to tap into the best thinking of their members, promoting their fullest commitment. It strengthens communication, encourages teamwork, facilitates effective leadership and provides a climate of mutual respect that lays a firm foundation for setting and achieving goals. Consensus is attempted widely, but there are few instructions for its use. The process seems simple, yet without training or skilled facilitation, it can run into snags. In the Quaker tradition, consensus decision making has been used successfully for more than 350 years to bring spiritual discernment into the business of group meetings. Alpha Institute unites the kindred impulses of intentional communities, bringing the deep toolbox of Quaker-based decision making. Presenter Caroline Estes has more than 40 years' experience working by consensus and training others in the process. Caroline's belief is that consensus is an appropriate form of decision making for our age, and that it is often misused. She is a board member and past president of the Fellowship for Intentional Community, and often acts as a spokesperson for community ideals and values.
