
# Examining income risk factors for people with disabilities


Third Quarter Report October 2009





The unemployment rate for people with disabilities is significantly higher than for those with no disabilities.

#### **Unemployment rates**




Unemployment rates for people with disabilities and those with no disabilities continued to climb. The unemployment rate for people with disabilities averaged 16.1 percent for the third quarter 2009, compared to 9.3 percent for people with no disabilities. People with disabilities experienced an unemployment rate 73 percent higher than people with no disabilities in the third quarter of 2009.

#### **Unemployment rates**




The gap in unemployment rates between people with and without disabilities widened during the third quarter. The monthly unemployment rates during the third quarter were the three highest recorded for people with disabilities for the year to date.

Social Security Disability Insurance applications increased 23 percent in first nine months of 2009 compared to the same period in 2008.

#### **SSDI** applications



The number of people applying for Social Security Disability Insurance benefits climbed by 23 percent when comparing the first nine months 2008 to the first nine months 2009. The number of applications in 2009 rose 8 percent from the first quarter to the third quarter.
