Regulation Scope

- Applies to all persons that own, license, store or maintain personal information about a resident of the Commonwealth in paper or electronic form.
- Organizations must comply by March 1, 2010

Regulation Objectives

- Establishes minimum standards to be met in connection with the safeguarding of personal information contained in both paper and electronic records.
- Insure the security and confidentiality of personal information in a manner fully consistent with industry standards.
- Protect against anticipated threats or hazards to the security or integrity of personal information
- Protect against unauthorized access to or use of such information that creates risk of identity theft or fraud against a resident of the Commonwealth.
