



Quick Start

This section shows you how to search your computer for duplicate files.

1. Select “Exact duplicate files” in Search Criteria, or click Review => Define report to select “Exact-content duplicate file (Recommended)” (by default).
2. Click [Browse...] to select folder or type in folder name.
3. Click [Search] button to start the search.



4. Search Result is shown, you can review files by selecting the file on the result panel, click Review and choose the action listed on the menu.




5. Click the check box or use [Smart Marker] to mark the file you want to handle.
