# Dr. Borko Djordjevic

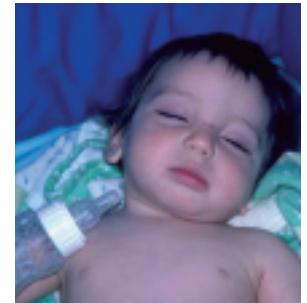
