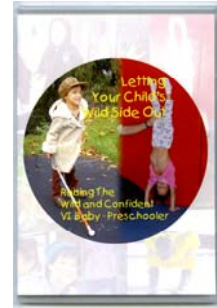


## Unique, New DVD: *Letting Your Child's Wild Side Out: Raising the Wild and Confident Blind Baby, Toddler and Preschooler*

- Are you looking for a unique way to suggest recreational activities to families with a young child who is visually-impaired?

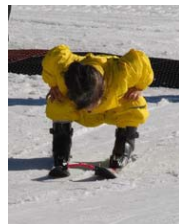


Then you should consider this one-of-a-kind multimedia DVD, developed by the parents of a kindergartener who is blind.

Families will benefit greatly by hearing from the child's mother, in her own words. As she does with conference audiences nationwide, she shares activities the family made available to their daughter, from birth to age five. In 30 minutes, you'll see the child grow from baby to downhill skier, gaining a strong sense of self-confidence and eagerness to learn at every stage.

This content will inspire you. It will motivate the families you serve by providing specific ideas of what they can do now (and in the future) with their small child. Most importantly, you'll see the results: a truly confident, creative and capable little girl.
