

## HERO PILOT & NOBEL PEACE PRIZE WINNER TO HEADLINE LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION IN SYDNEY - JUNE 28-JULY 2

**Sydney, AUSTRALIA, June 28, 2010**—Chesley B. (Sully) Sullenberger III, the American pilot who landed a jet plane on the Hudson River near New York, and Wangari Maathai, winner of the 2004 Nobel Peace Prize, are Sydney-bound as keynote speakers for the 93rd Lions Clubs International Convention.
