#6 in the Nation, #1 Among Ranked Hospitals in New York Area

NEW YORK (July 15, 2010) — NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital, one of the country's largest and most comprehensive academic medical centers, is ranked #6 in the nation and #1 among ranked hospitals in the New York area, according to U.S. News Media Group's 2010-11 Best Hospitals.
