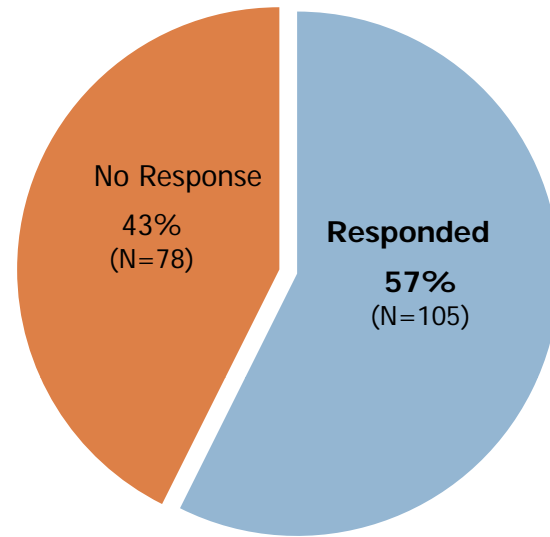

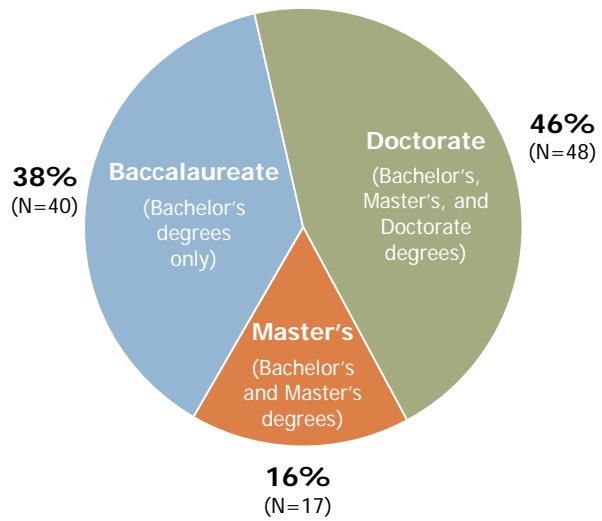
2009-10 Response Rate



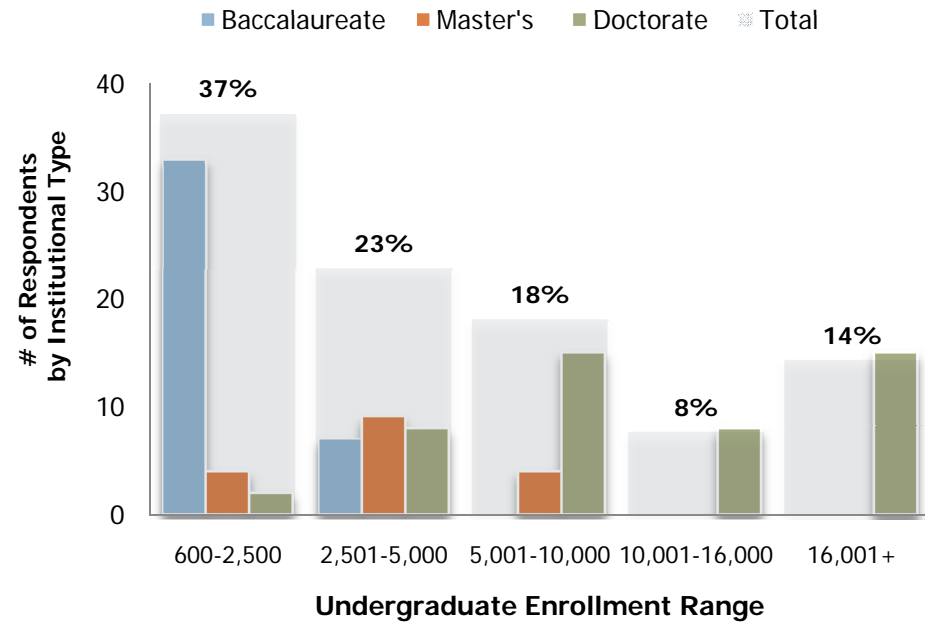

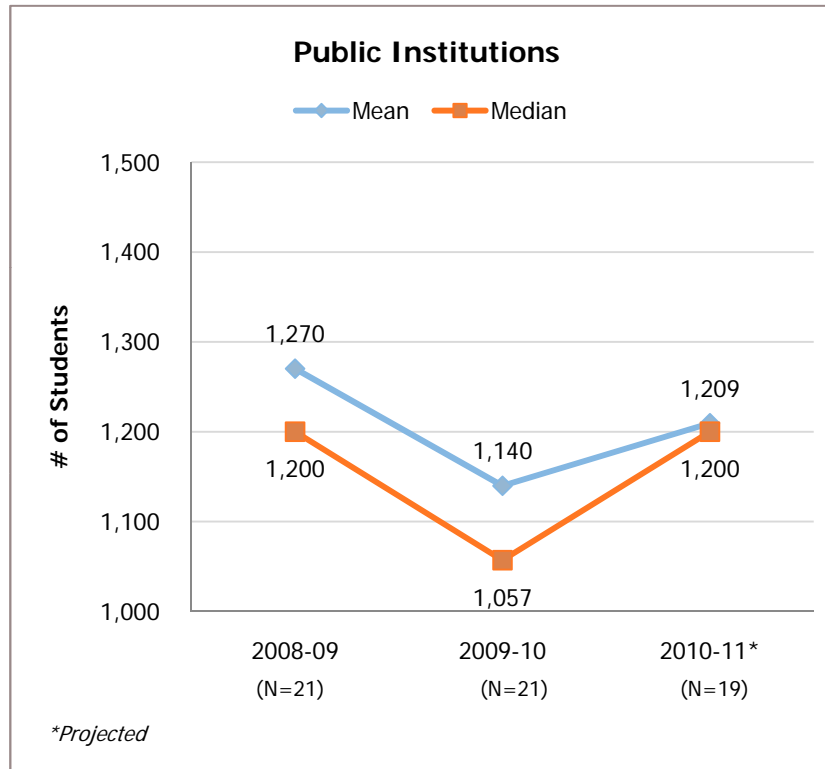
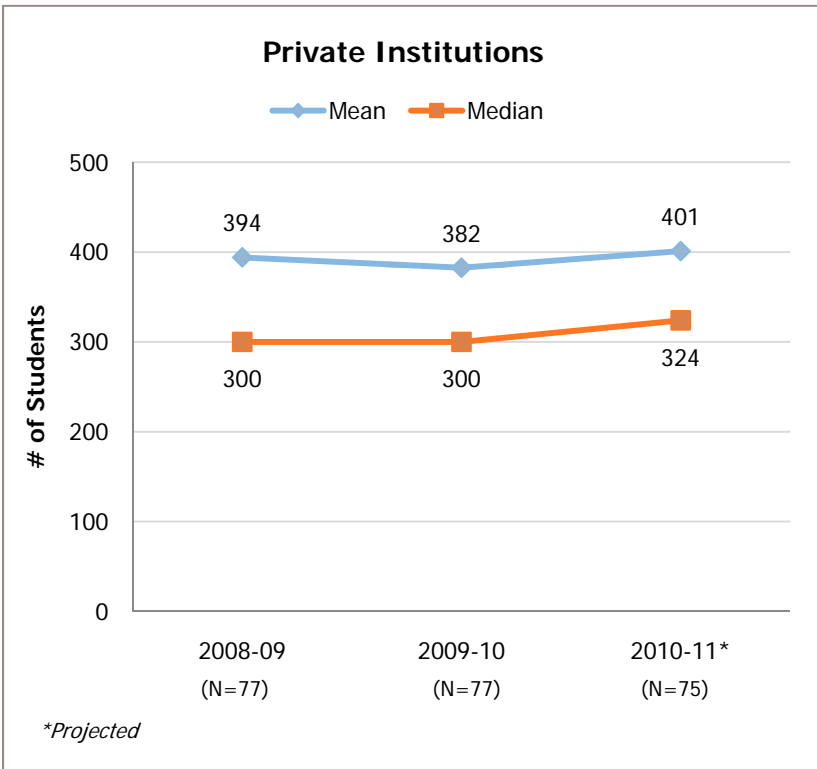


### Estimated Undergraduate Enrollment Range

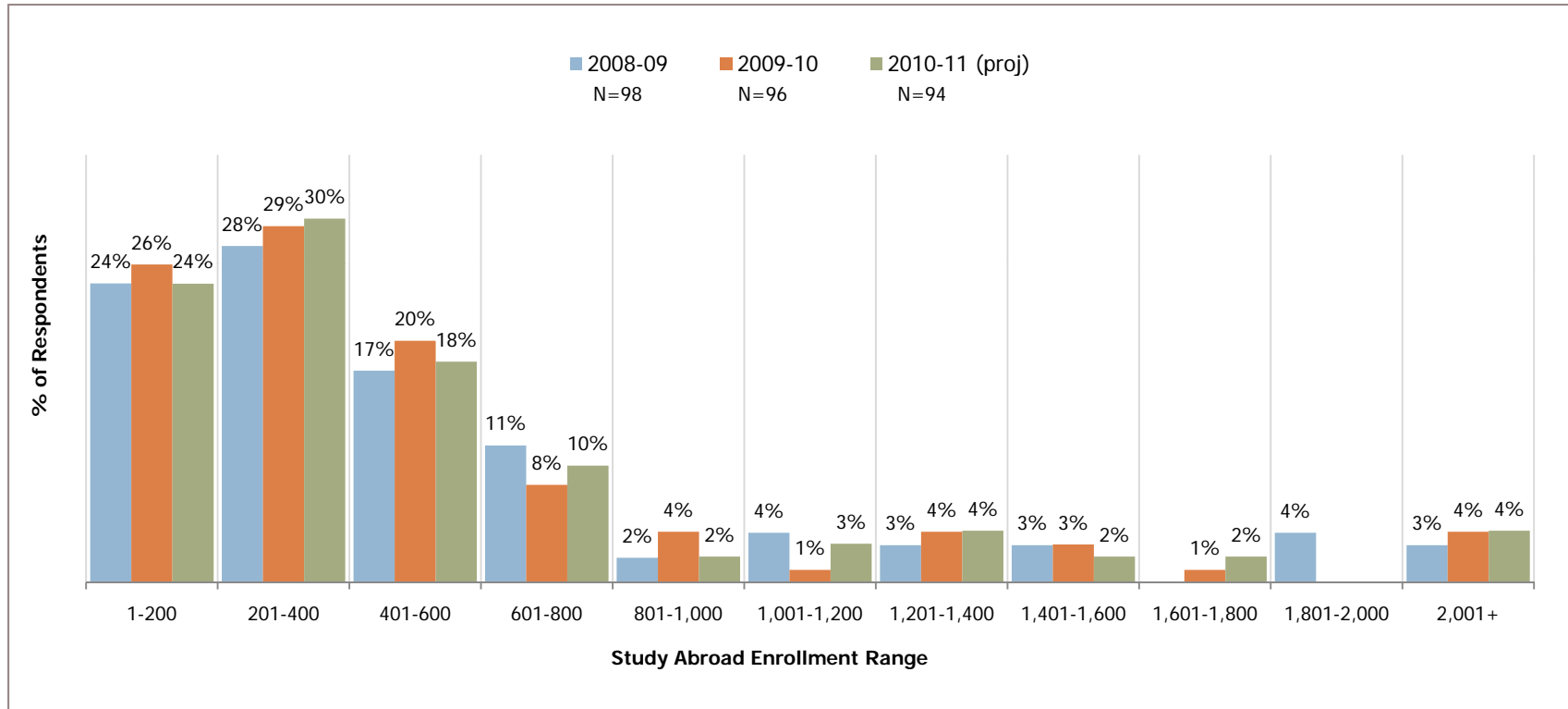

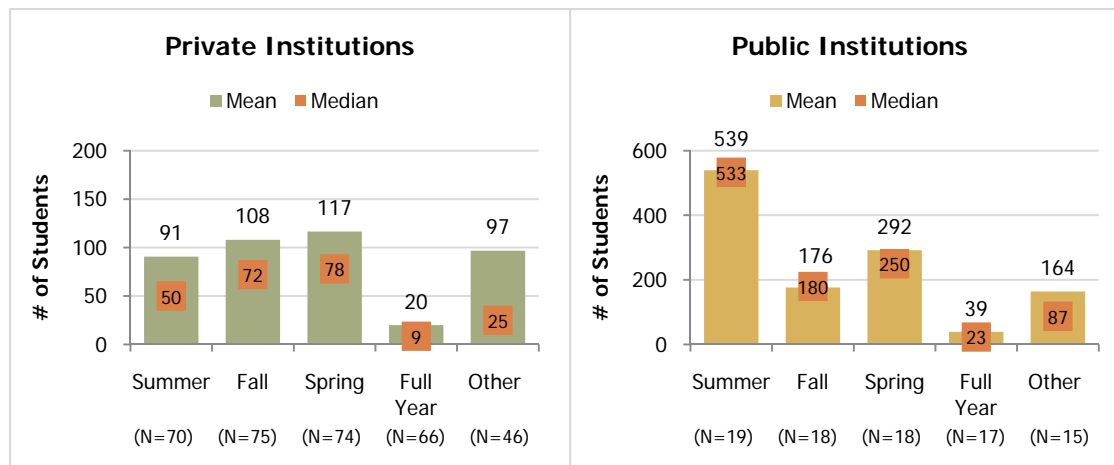
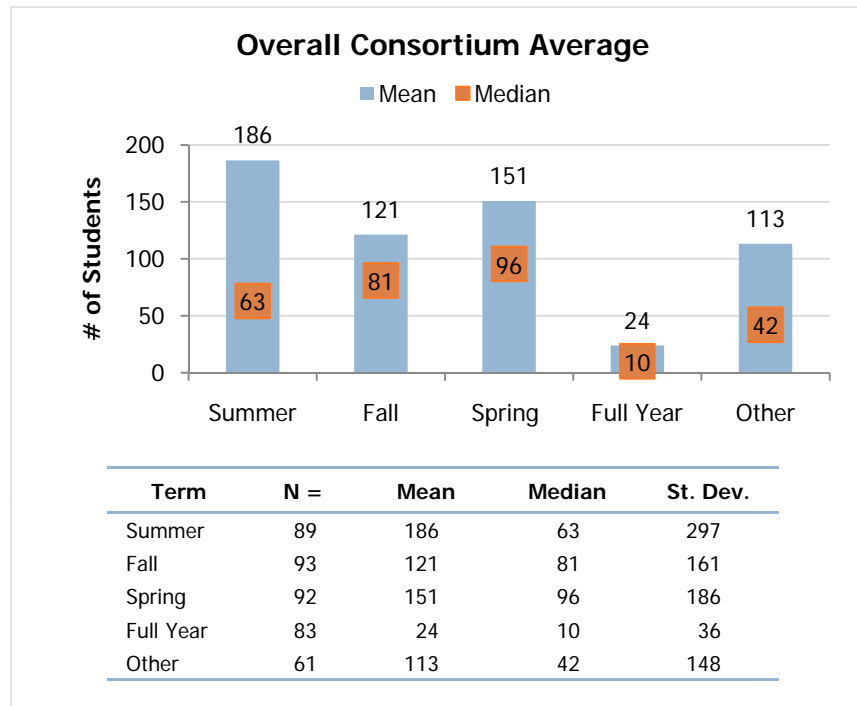
**Average Study Abroad Enrollment by Private/Public Status**



### 3-Year Trend/Forecast in Total Study Abroad Enrollments

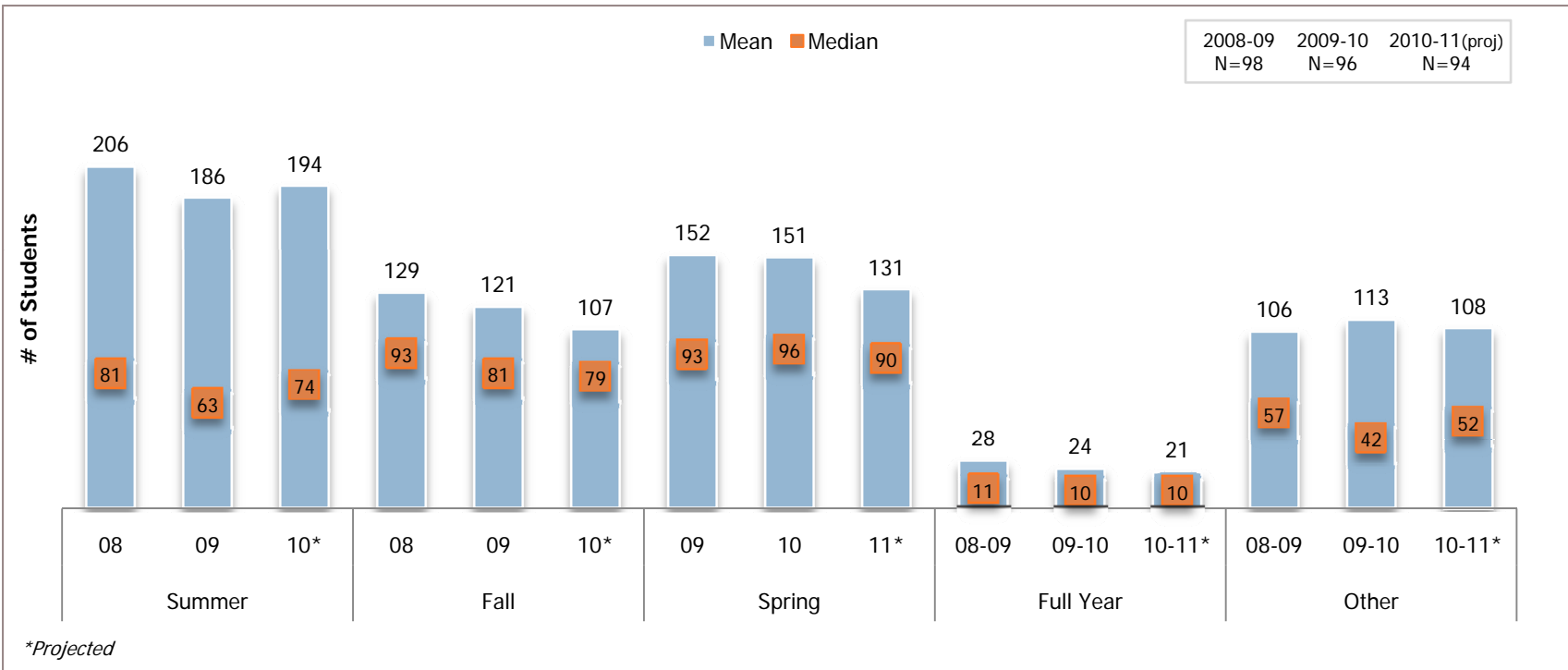


## 2009-10 Average Study Abroad Enrollments by Term



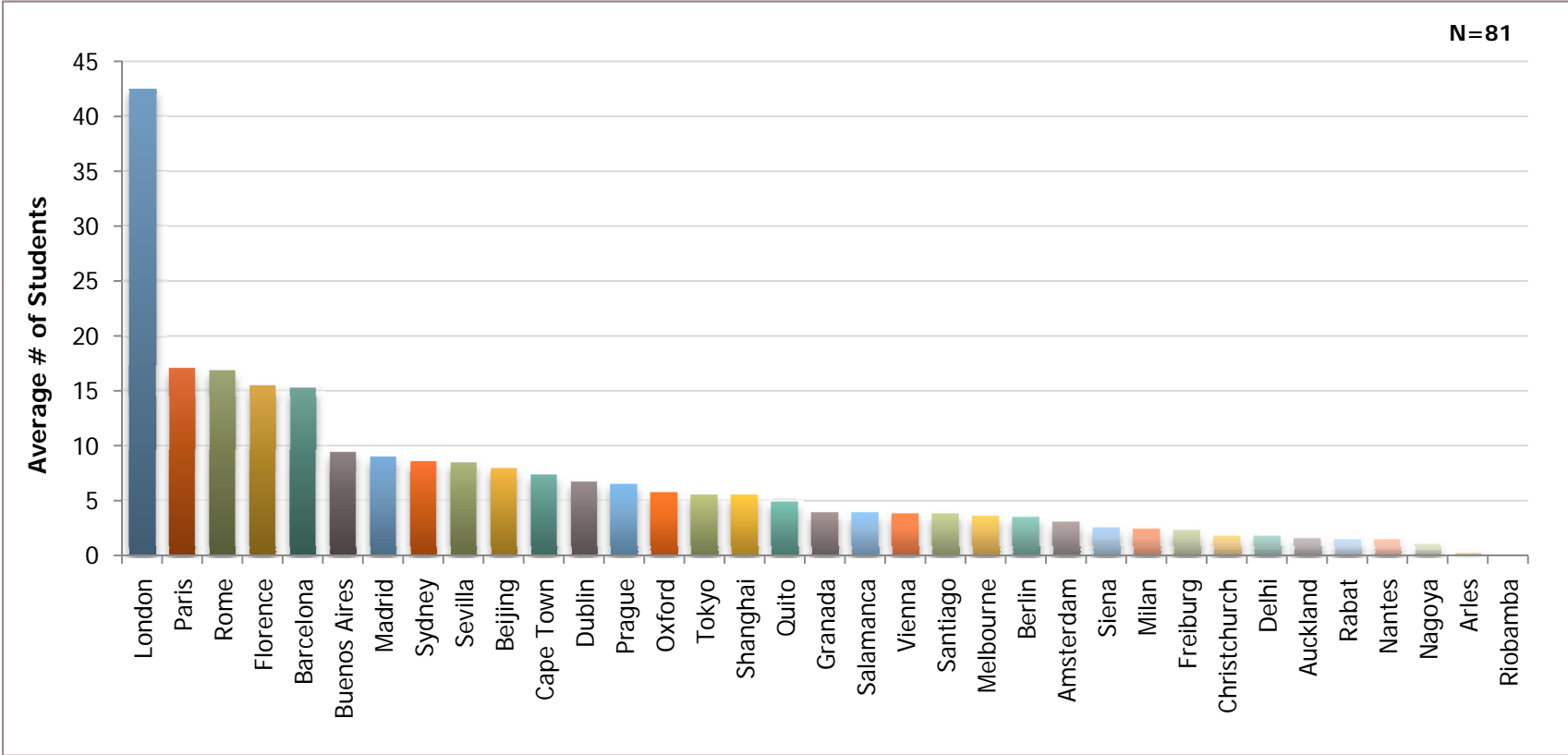

### 3-Year Trend/Forecast by Term



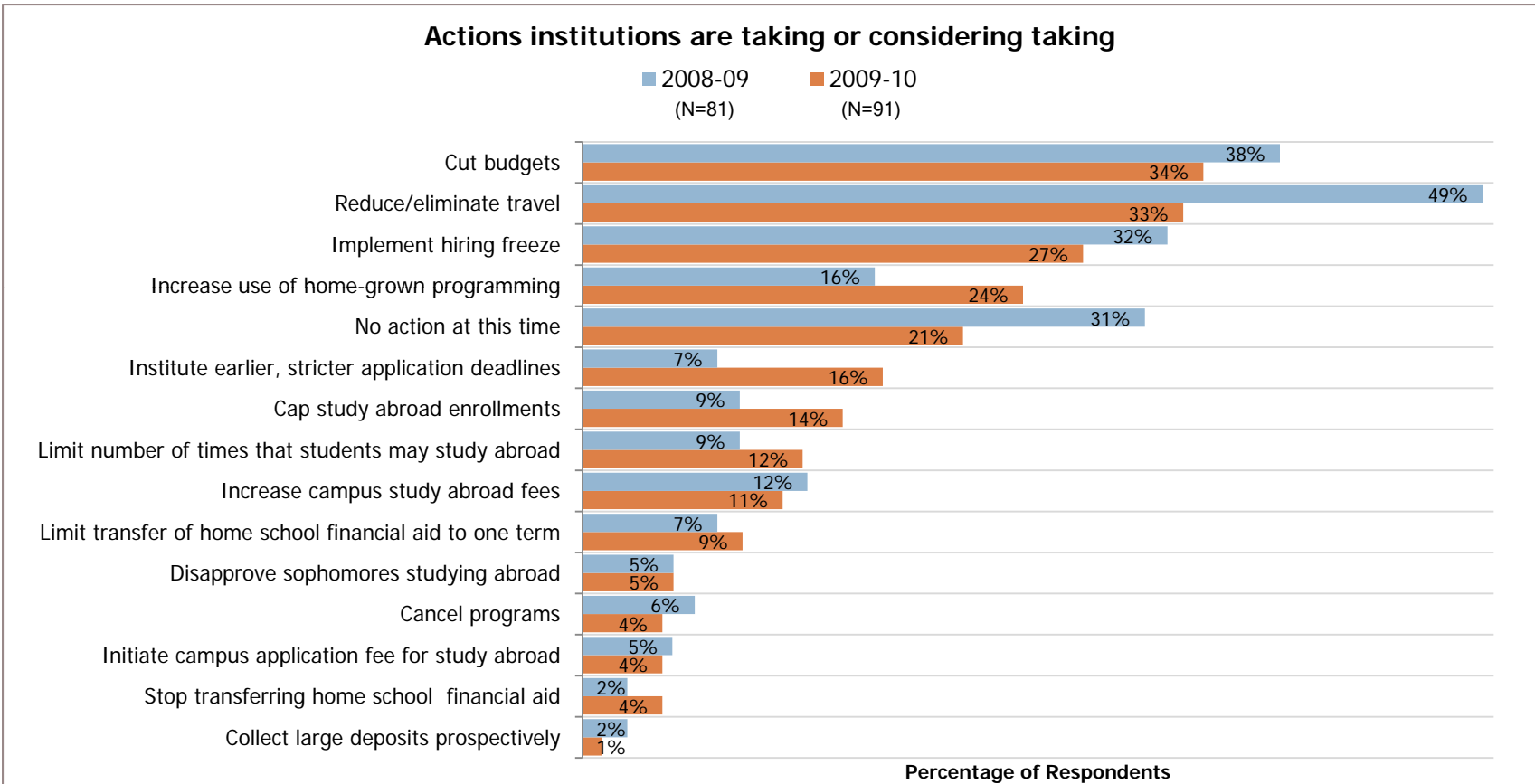

2009-10 Study Abroad Enrollments in Select Cities



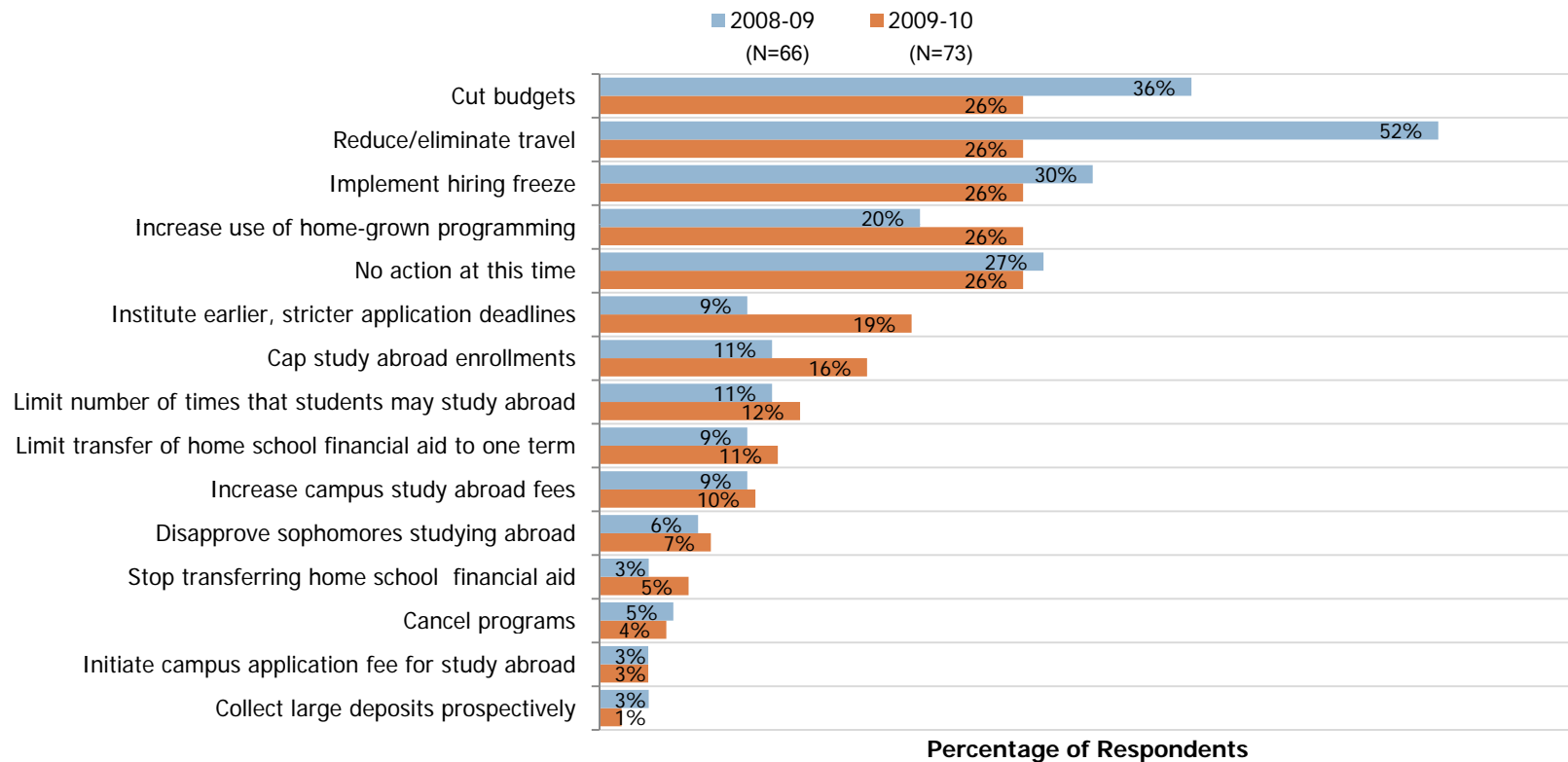

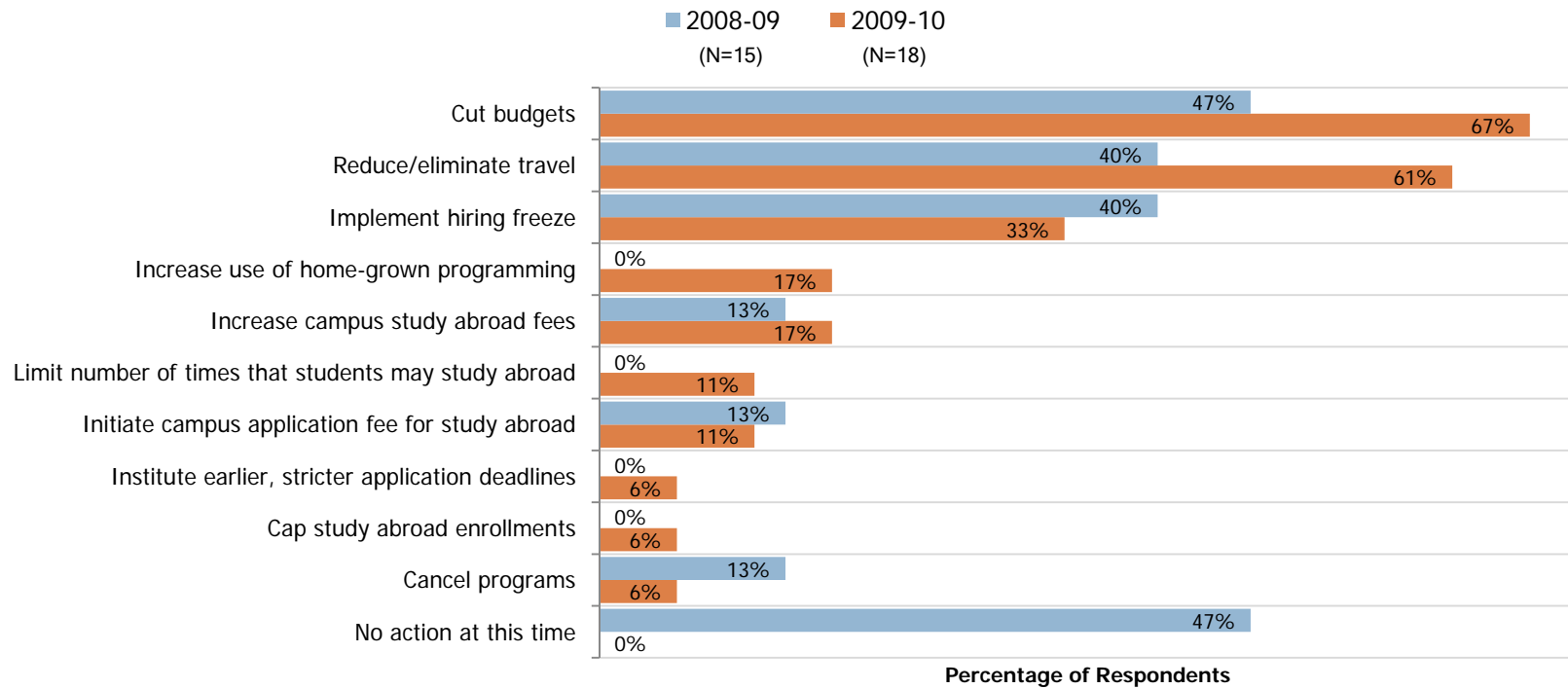
