In order to avoid printing frustrations and leave scary moments for Halloween night and not during the preparation time, the following are some useful printing tips that we've gathered during the many years of experience in the printing world. Our specialty is printer ink but knowing how to use it is part of the job!

#### Printing Tips for Patterns (pumpkin and jack O' lantern):

• Remember that the end product is your pumpkin, so be sure to print with black ink on draft mode to save on ink.

• Another thing you can consider is using slightly used paper - that on which you printed a few words or just the date by mistake and you obviously recycle for this kind of things-.

• After you carve your masterpiece take a picture, because your pumpkin won't last for long but a picture lasts forever! Now you should print that picture in the best quality possible. (See Link page for Photo Printing Tips)

#### **Green Halloween Printing Tips:**

- Remember that using recycled and remanufactured printing accessories is most important when talking about a Green Halloween.
- Inkjetsuperstore.com is proud of being able to provide the best remanufactured ink and toner cartridges year round, and help you print and save the environment at the same time.
- When printing your invitations, posters and postcards, be sure to use recycled paper and make the entire printing experience "green"

#### **Mask Printing Tips**

- Make sure you preview your mask before printing. It takes a few minutes more but you'll be sure it is all within printing borders.
- Use thick paper. Obviously, use cardboard paper in order for your mask to hold on through the scary night.
- Full color is better than draft mode. Don't try to save ink because the effect will not

be the same. If you are taking the time to make your own mask, print it full color all the way.

• Adding contact paper after printing and before adding the strings will make your mask stronger and why not water proof. Who knows what might happen during the night? Trick or treating can get wet sometimes.

### **Halloween Safety Tips**

Halloween is a time for fun and treats, but it can also be dangerous if you're not careful. Falls are a leading cause of injuries among children. Because so many of them are out walking, about four times as many children ages 5 to 14 are killed in motorvehicle-related accidents on Halloween night compared with other nights of the year. But many Halloween-related injuries can be prevented if parents and children follow these tips from the National Safety Council, American Academy of Pediatrics, and the Centers for Disease Control:

#### Parents designing costumes should:

- Buy costumes or wigs that are labeled flame retardant or flame resistant.
- Put reflective tape on the fronts and backs of kids' costumes.
- Make sure children's costumes fit loosely enough to allow for freedom of movement.
- Be sure that the hemline doesn't fall below the ankle (to prevent tripping).
- Use knives that are made of cardboard or flexible material. Do not allow children to carry sharp objects.
- Avoid using masks, if possible, because they obstruct a child's vision. Use face paint instead. Or, if a child really wants to wear a mask, make sure it has nose and mouth openings and large eye holes.

#### Children trick-or-treating should:

- Travel only in familiar areas and along an established route.
- Walk, not run, from house to house.
- Use flashlights, stay on sidewalks and avoid crossing yards.
- Go only to well-lit houses and remain on porches rather than entering houses.
- Travel in small groups and be accompanied by an adult if they're under age 12.
- Know their phone number and carry coins for emergency telephone calls. (Or carry a cell phone, if possible.)
- Bring candy home before eating it so parents can inspect it.
- Avoid wearing hats that will slide over their eyes.
- Cross streets at the corner and use crosswalks. They shouldn't cross between parked cars.
- Stop at all corners and stay together in a group while waiting to cross.
- Be reminded to look left, right and left again before crossing the street.

#### Parents and adults at home should:

- Give kids a big meal before heading out to trick-or-treat so they're not tempted to eat candy before they get home.
- Establish a return time for older children.
- Prepare homes for trick-or-treaters by clearing porches, lawns and sidewalks and by placing jack-o'-lanterns away from doorways and landings.
- Avoid doling out choking hazards such as gum, peanuts, hard candies or small toys as treats to young children.
- Inspect all candy for safety before children eat it. Watch for signs of tampering, such as small pinholes in wrappers and torn or loose packages.

#### Motorists should:

- Drive slowly.
- Watch for children in the street and on medians.
- Enter and exit driveways and alleyways carefully.
- Look for children in dark clothing once the sun goes down.
