**Jan Daley CD Release and Release Concert:
Where There's Hope –A Tribute to the Love Songs From Bob Hope's Legacy**

New York – Nov. 4 – Gorgeous West Coast Songstress, Jan Daley, will appear at The Metropolitan Room in New York City in November for one show celebrating the release of her new CD on Encore Music Presents Records. "Where There's Hope" is a tribute to the love songs from her former boss Bob Hope's Legacy. Daley toured with Hope all over the wartime globe, including Viet Nam, as the singing star of his troop shows, entertaining over 100,000 GI Joes and Janes. Her show will include fantastic vintage film of her in VietNam on one of the tours. "Where There's Hope" was recorded with Les Brown Jr.'s Band of Renown, and produced by Brown. The Metropolitan Room show is Sunday, November 14 at 7pm. She'll be joined by the fabulous Shelly Markham on piano.

Daley conceived her tribute to the beloved funny man when she was asked by the Hope family to sing "Thanks For The Memory" (with special lyrics) at Hope's funeral service. Always thought of mainly as one of the most important comedians in history, Hope was a charming song and dance man who debuted several of the American Songbooks most beloved tunes, including "I Can't Get Started" and "It's De-Lovely," both of which are included on "Where There's Hope." The disc also features Cole Porter's 'You Do Something to Me' and "Thanks For The Memory" by Leo Robin and Ralph Grainger.

The elegant and statuesque singer/actress/songwriter is a Los Angeles native who was crowned Miss California, an early achievement which launched her show business career. Jan broke into television early on iconic vehicles like the Tonight Show and The Merv Griffin Show; she also starred in musical specials for television. Her recording of the theme "Till Love Touches Your Life" was an Academy Award nominee for the 1970 film, MADRON. Her first gig in Las Vegas was with Louis Armstrong, and she has been the opening act for many huge stars including Don Rickles, David Brenner and the late Rodney Dangerfield. She has appeared in series television, films and in over 150 television commercials. As a songwriter, Jan has written the music for a Jimmy Webb house music project, and her songs appear on Kathy Smith's Walking Workout CDs. She recently completed a six month run starring in "The Follies" in Branson, MO followed by "And Then She Wrote" with Peter Marshall and Mimi Hines and the Broadway bound "Showgirl on 52nd Street." Daley has recorded five albums, the latest being "Where There's Hope."
