Cautious homeowners not moving with the times

- Contradictory patterns indicate an uncertain market
- The South West is seeing significant numbers of new residents
- London areas are out of favour

Rosemary Rogers, Director, reallymoving.com comments:

"The news agenda throughout the third quarter was dominated by the impending Spending Review. According to reallymoving.com research, activity was down 2.6% compared to the already low levels recorded in the period April-June.

"With the government warning the country of dramatic cuts, contradictory signals from property indices and mortgage lenders continuing to be highly selective, many homeowners and renters have chosen to hold back from moving home. We expect this trend to continue over the coming months as consumers remain cautious over the impact of the spending review."

"For those who were moving over the last quarter a few observations can be made. With Dorchester, Taunton and Hereford all featuring in the top 5 most popular areas, the South West has drawn the highest proportion of new residents, continuing a trend from Q2. By contrast East and South West London have seen more people move away than move in. However, the absence of a clear moving pattern is indicative of an uncertain market, where activity levels remain subdued."

Locals Losing Out in Truro?

- Truro is retaining few residents despite seeing a significant influx of new residents
- St Albans retained the highest proportion of its residents
- Ilford saw just 19% of movers stay within the area

Rosemary Rogers, Director, reallymoving.com comments:

"Ilford appears in the bottom 5 for local moves for the second successive quarter while St Albans has retained the highest proportion of its residents. The surprising statistic of the quarter is that Truro retained just 29% of its residents despite the fact it saw the highest proportionate influx of residents in Q2 and is now ninth in Q3. This suggests that the large numbers of out-of-towners moving to trendy Cornwall is forcing out some of the towns current residents."

About the reallymoving.com Migration Monitor

The Migration Monitor is a quarterly report on home-moving trends in the UK, based on information entered by users of reallymoving.com. The Migration Monitor is based on data from 13,105 registrations for quotes for moving services such as Conveyancing, Home Removals and Surveys in the third quarter of 2010.

Table A measures the number of people moving to a postcode area as a percentage of the number that moved away in Q3 2010. A negative percentage indicates that more people moved away from the area than moved in.

Table B measures the number of people staying within a postcode area as a percentage of the total moves from that area.
