The Residency Program

The Objective: An 18-month program of post-professional clinical and didactic education for physical therapists designed to advance the physical therapist resident's preparation as a provider of patient care services in orthopaedic physical therapy.

The Experience: An intensive combination of didactic, collaborative and clinical education experiences using a combination of distance learning, on-line courses, weekend intensive hands-on courses and clinical practice hours.

The Opportunity: Ongoing clinical supervision and mentoring, with a theoretical basis for advanced practice and scientific inquiry.

The Outcome: EIM's Residency Program is designed so that graduates will:

- Grow as practitioners skilled in orthopaedic physical therapy.
- Become highly skilled, autonomous practitioners who have substantially increased their ability to provide care to patients with musculoskeletal conditions.
- Gain a strong base of knowledge of evidence-based practice, orthopaedic manual therapy techniques, advanced medical screening and radiology.
- Be positioned to both achieve the Orthopaedic Certified Specialist (OCS) certification from the ABPTS and to be leaders in the orthopaedic physical therapy field.

- All residents accepted into the program have successfully completed an APTA-accredited professional physical therapy curriculum.
- All residents must have a current license to practice physical therapy. This license must not be under suspension, revocation, probationary status or subject to disciplinary proceedings or inquiry.
