This summer semester program takes a dynamic approach to food studies, combining hands-on culinary training with an in-depth survey of Vermont food systems. Students are deeply immersed in the rural experience, farming, cooking, and engaging with food entrepreneurs.

Vermont's Table is offered in two 5-week sessions. Students are encouraged to attend both sessions, but can apply for only one. Some cooking experience is helpful, but not required. (Space is limited to 12 participants.)
