How To Select the Right Server For Your Virtual Assistant Business

So you've registered your domain name and now you're trying to decide where to host your website. There are many options, you can host it yourself with your own server or you can outsource that task to a service provider.

A website host generally offers two main services, they provide internet connectivity to your website and they provide a data center, they store the files

necessary to run your internet business. When you think about it, this data center or server is a very important job because the wrong server can put your files at risk for corruption, loss, and spam.

Here are a few things to look for to select the right server for your small business:

Make sure the control panel is easy to use. Of course you won't know this before trying it out, however most providers offer the ability to take a trial, sometimes it's a week and sometimes it's a 30 day trial. Use this trial to make sure it's the right system for you.

Make sure they offer round the clock

support. You never know when something is going to happen and having to wait until 'normal business hours' can cost you tons of lost time and revenue. Your server must have 24/7 customer service. And the support system whether it's on the telephone, via email or chat needs to be recordable so you can reference the information, save it in the event you need it again or need it for backup.

Look for a server that promises uptime. This means your website is up and running 99-100% of the time. This must be guaranteed.

Look for a server that backs up your server on a daily basis. Some back up less often however you don't' want to lose any information on your website and if someone hacks it, you want to be able to quickly upload the last saved version with little or no downtime.

Know what type of server you're getting. There are different types of servers including:

Shared web hosting service – your website is on the same server as many other websites and you all share the same resources.

Dedicated hosting service – you receive your own web server and have full

control over it and you are responsible for the security and maintenance.

Managed hosting service – you get your own web server but do not have full control over it. Security, backups and so on are taken care of by the provider.

Choosing the right server isn't a small choice, however there are a number of qualified providers available. Compare service providers based on what they can do for your business first and then compare prices as the final decision maker.

Being the recipient of the Thomas Leonard award, Dale knows his way around the VA industry and offers this advice to other VA's – "You cannot afford to work with someone who cannot afford to work with you. When you take the time to calculate how much you should receive to cover your expenses and you have a potential client haggling you down to less than that price point, you de-value your business and your talents. A potential client will likely not appreciate your overall value. It may foster a growing resentment toward your new client and eventually may lead to letting that client go. Or, your client may start looking elsewhere for the next cheapest solution. In the long term, standing firm on your rates will produce a viable and sustainable business."

WM: Thank you very much. What a delightful introduction, and yes, I will put on my best deep Australian accent voice for you. It's funny I lived in Texas for 12 months in Dallas, Texas boy and they have a very strong accent. But it's an absolute pleasure to be here and Dale just so you know, we actually call them prawns not shrimp – but when we advertise to the rest of the world we happily use your words. It's all part of the fun.

Hey, let's kick it off and get going. ...



Yeah don't put prawns on a barbie. No I do actually. Prawns on a barbie are good. They're just always difficult to peel.

I want to talk today just really quickly 'cause I've got about half an hour left now is to talk about how to be a goal getter and not just a goal setter.

A lot of people talk about how you can set goals and achieve more etcetera.

But before we get started I just wanted to get a bit of an idea if any of you when you start the day feel a bit like this – when you've got that kind of feeling when you're just like oh my here we go again. Like you know all your clients want more of your time, your kids want more of your time, your partner wants more of your time and you wish you had more time for yourself. You know, a lot of VAs I know they go 'Oh yes I want to work for myself 'cause it'll give me freedom and everything'. How's that going for you?

For a lot of people it works but there are some people like 'Oh my god I work harder in my own business than I ever worked working for someone else, and not only do I work harder for myself I'm spending more time working.

And as Pam is saying 'Freedom? What freedom?'

Because you're at home you're nearly always at work. So sometimes it's not as the vision that we had. So there's a couple of things we can do about it.

But before we get started, everyone in life has the question 'What's in it for me'. So today I what I wanted to do is just let you know what's in it for you in terms of this is what you can expect to get out of today.
