OVERVIEW

Salesian Missions, Inc., is headquartered in New Rochelle, NY. The mission of the U.S.-based nonprofit Catholic organization is to raise funds for its international programs that serve youth and families in poor communities around the globe. The Salesian missionaries (Salesians of Don Bosco) are made up of priests, brothers and sisters, as well as laypeople – all dedicated to caring for poor children around the globe.

Salesian Missions has an active presence in more than 130 **countries spanning all five continents**, in some of the most impoverished and dangerous locations on the planet.

The focus of the international work is to not just provide for the youth of the world, but to teach them how to provide for themselves, their families and their communities. Therefore, each program is embedded into the local community and is customized for their needs.

The Salesians are regarded as the single largest provider of vocational and technical training in the world.

When disaster strikes – as it did in Haiti for example – they are among the first on the scene with relief supplies, temporary housing and medical care.

The Salesians work in big cities with thousands of homeless and runaway children as well as reach out to remote corners of the globe that have been forgotten and neglected by the rest of society.

The Salesian Missions Office for International Programs has been entrusted by dozens of government agencies and humanitarian organizations to be the stewards of funds dedicated to education programs for desperately poor children.

- The Salesians operate more than **3,400 youth education and trade schools**, **23 colleges, more than 90 agricultural schools**, **216 clinics and hospitals**, **225 orphanages and shelters**, and a wide variety of social and economic development activities.
- The Salesians of Don Bosco are led by nearly **34,000 priests, brothers and sisters** who serve as Salesians of Don Bosco (S.D.B.), the second largest order in the Roman Catholic Church. We are


HISTORY
