
# Examining income risk factors for people with disabilities


2011 First Quarter April 2011





The unemployment rate for people with disabilities continues to be significantly higher than for those with no disabilities.

#### **Quarterly unemployment rates**




The unemployment rate for people with disabilities rose slightly in the first quarter of 2011 and is higher when compared to first quarter 2010. For first quarter 2011, people with disabilities experienced an unemployment rate 60 percent higher than people with no disabilities.

#### 15-month unemployment rates




After narrowing slightly in January, the unemployment rate gap between people with and without disabilities began widening at the end of the first quarter. In March 2011, people with disabilities had an unemployment rate 1.7 points higher than a year ago, 15.6 percent in 2011 compared with 13.9 percent in 2010. At the same time, the unemployment rate for people without disabilities dropped 1.2 points, to 8.9 percent in March 2011 compared with 10.1 percent in March 2010. People with disabilities consistently have a higher unemployment rate and greater volatility in joblessness than those without disabilities.
