This series pays tribute to rarely seen films with extraordinary Production Design

June 26, Agora (2009), Egyptian Theatre Production Designer Guy Hendrix Dyas - Oscar®-nominated for INCEPTION rebuilds Roman Alexandria, 400A.D., for director Alejandro Amenabar and a story of ancient cultures in collision. A panel discussion follows with Dyas and set decorator Larry Dias, moderated by John Muto.





July 31, **The Boyfriend** (1971), Aero Theatre Stage and screen designer Tony Walton lovingly recreates the definitive Busby Berkeley backstage fantasy musical, but in widescreen and color; with Twiggy and Tommy Tune. A conversation with Production Designer Walton and Thomas A. Walsh will follow the screening.


August 21, Das Boot (1981), Egyptian Theatre Oscar-winning Production Designer Rolf Zehetbauer (CABARET) brings chilling authenticity to the nightmare of life aboard a German U-boat during World War II. A panel discussion will be moderated by Thomas A. Walsh.





September 25, *Frida* (2002), Aero Theatre Mexico City, the 1930s – the exotic demimonde of artists Frida Kahlo (Salma Hayek) and Diego Rivera (Alfred Molina) is deftly rendered by Production Designer Felipe Fernandez del Paso. The film was Oscar nominated for both the art direction / set decoration and the costume design by Julie Weiss. A panel discussion will be moderated by John Muto.

October 23, Land of the Pharaohs (1955), Egyptian Theatre The ultimate Egyptian cult classic – at the Egyptian! Directed by Howard Hawks (GENTLEMEN PREFER BLONDES), written by William Faulkner (THE SOUND AND THE FURY), and starring Joan Collins (DYNASTY, STAR TREK). Oscarwinning Production Designer Alexander Trauner (CHILDREN OF PARADISE) revises everything we think we know about the building of the pyramids. A panel discussion will follow, moderated by both Mr. Muto and Mr. Walsh.
