Award-Winning Web Series "Vlog Star" Announces Final Season

LOS ANGELES, June 30, 2011 – The long-running, award-winning web series *Vlog Star* is set to premiere its fourth and final season starting July 13.

Written and produced by Kenny Byerly and David J. Duman through their production company, Sit Thru This Productions, and created by Kenny Byerly and Mike Ludwig, *Vlog Star* is a comedic web series following the misadventures of Nate Klugman, a faded Internet video star with delusions of grandeur, and his long-suffering, torch-



carrying best friend, Alexa. Along the way, Nate butts heads with his stepbrother Max, whose success he resents, and Alexa's roommate Shelly, who tries in vain to help Alexa escape Nate's influence. Last season's cliffhanger found Alexa leaving Nate for a new manager/love interest, while Nate becomes the conquest of a sexy YouTube groupie who may be too much for him to handle.

Season 4's episodes will appear on <u>www.vlogstarshow.com</u> and <u>www.youtube.com/</u> <u>vlogstarshow</u> every Wednesday through August 31, bringing the story to a long-awaited, satisfying conclusion. By the end of its run, *Vlog Star* will have produced a total of 54 episodes since its debut on September 2, 2008 – a major accomplishment in the world of narrative web series. Throughout its run, it has been produced on a shoestring budget with a skeleton crew of as little as one and seldom more than two.



Vlog Star was an official selection of the Los Angeles Web Series Festival for two years running (2010-2011), where it won awards for Outstanding Comedy Series, Outstanding Writing in a Comedy Series, Outstanding Lead Actor in a Comedy Series, Outstanding Lead Actress in a Comedy Series, and Outstanding Guest Actress in a Comedy Series. Festival founder Michael Ajakwe called the show "hilarious... proof of what can be done when you have talent on top of talent on top of talent."

premiered at the fall 2010 Bagavagabonds Art Explosion, "Iron Man 2 Deleted Scene," "Disaster Movie: Meet the Writers," "Wicker: The Best Thing Ever," and the parody music videos "Scrabulous" and "Credit Card."
