The Fellowship Program

The Objective: A 12-24 month program of post-professional clinical and didactic education for physical therapists designed to graduate clinician scientists skilled in the evidence-based integration of thrust and non-thrust manipulation and other advanced manual therapy techniques. Fellowship graduates will be prepared for leadership in the teaching orthopedic manual physical therapy, as well as active participants and contributors to clinical research.

The Experience: An intensive combination of didactic, collaborative and clinical education experiences using a combination of distance learning, on-line courses, weekend intensive hands-on courses and clinical practice hours.

The Opportunity: Ongoing clinical supervision, outcomes monitoring and mentoring, with a theoretical basis for advanced practice and scientific inquiry in the area of orthopedic manual physical therapy.

The Outcome: EIM's Fellowship Program is designed so that graduates will:

- Value the principles of EBP and behave accordingly in their daily practice.
- Be expert practitioners skilled in the EBP integration of orthopaedic manual physical therapy techniques in the management of musculoskeletal conditions.
- Confidently and professionally interact with other members of the healthcare team and provide leadership in the area of evidence based care.
- Be leaders in clinical practice, clinical research and the business of physical therapy who are
 positioned to assume leadership roles in the APTA, the AAOMPT and physical therapy
 practices throughout the United States.

Application Process

Cohorts begin every summer and winter. EIM requests notification of intent to participate in the summer cohort by May 1 and the winter cohort by November 1. Completed applications, regardless of notification of intent, are to be submitted by June 1 and December 1. Applications may be expedited after deadlines, however, we ask that you contact EIM's coordinator of admissions, Donna Cunningham (admissions@eimpt.com) for assistance.

Admission Requirements

- All fellows accepted into the program must have successfully completed an APTA-accredited professional physical therapy curriculum.
- All fellows must have a current license to practice physical therapy. This license must not be under suspension, revocation, probationary status or subject to disciplinary proceedings or inquiry.
- 3. All fellows must be active members of the APTA.
- 4. All fellows must have current CPR certification.
- 5. Fellows must be graduates from an APTA accredited Orthopaedic Residency program, board certified in Orthopaedics by the ABPTS or eligible to sit for the Orthopaedic Certified Specialist examination. Additionally, we will consider therapists who 1) completed EIM's Sports Physical Therapy Residency Program; 2) are board certified in Sports by the ABPTS and; 3) are approved by the Program Director.
- Fellows must obtain additional course work in the area of evidencebased practice if the EIM Fellowship Program determines that the applicant's background in this area is insufficient.
- All fellows must be members of the AAOMPT in good standing.

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
