

AUTHOR BIO – Bonnie Bucqueroux

Speaking of Murder: Media Autopsies of Famous Crime Cases is Bonnie Bucqueroux' fourth book. The first was her ghostwritten biography of the late E.O. Marsh of Jackson, Michigan, discussed in the new book's Introduction. Books two and three were on the police reform called community policing, co-authored with the late Dr. Robert Trojanowicz. For nine years, Bucqueroux served as associate director of the National Center for Community Policing at Michigan State University's School of Criminal Justice.

Bucqueroux continues to teach journalism at Michigan State University's School of Journalism, where she served as coordinator for the Victims and the Media Program. She was also executive director of the Michigan Victim Alliance and a frequent consultant for the U.S. Department of Justice.

A National Magazine Award winner, Bucqueroux currently co-publishes [Lansing Online News](#), for which she does a weekly radio show and webcast. She has posted more than 500 videos to YouTube, and those videos have attracted more than 1.5 million visitors worldwide.
