## "THIS OTHER WORLD": PONCE DE LEÓN AND THE FOUNDING OF FLORIDA

# St. Augustine, Florida

ST. AUGUSTINE, FL – March 18, 2012 – To prepare for Florida's 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2013, Florida Living History, Inc. (FLH – <a href="www.floridalivinghistory.org/">www.floridalivinghistory.org/</a>), will offer its annual heritage Event – "*This Other World"*: *Ponce de León and the Founding of Florida*! Presented by FLH's member group – *La Compañía de Juan Ponce de León* / The Company of Juan Ponce de León (c. 1513 - 1521) – in partnership with the Florida Humanities Council, this living-history Event and lecture series will take place on Saturday, March 31<sup>st</sup>, from 10AM to 4PM, at the Mission Nombre de Dios Museum (<a href="www.missionandshrine.org/">www.missionandshrine.org/</a>), in St. Augustine, FL, the oldest, continually occupied European settlement and port in the continental United States. The Event will commemorate the landing of Don Juan Ponce de León's "First Fleet," which carried passengers and crew – white, black, Native American; male and female; soldier and sailor; slave and free – who became the first documented Europeans and Africans to set foot on what is now the continental United States, landing on the east coast of Florida on April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1513.

This heritage Event will feature interpretations and demonstrations of:

- the history of Ponce, his company, and his world;
- the crossbow in the early 16<sup>th</sup>-century Spanish Caribbean and Florida;
- the espingarda, America's oldest firearm;
- rodeleros Spain's sword-and-shield troops;
- early 16<sup>th</sup>-century cartography and navigation;
- historical foodways;
- "period" children's activities.

In addition, this Florida Living History, Inc. heritage Event will feature the second, annual "This Other World": Ponce de León and the Founding of Florida lectures on Don Juan Ponce de León and his world. The lectures will take place in the auditorium of the Mission Nombre de Dios Museum.
