
Course Description

From Norfolk International Airport (7 miles SW)

I-64 East towards Virginia Beach. I-264 West towards Downtown Norfolk. Exit 10 City Hall Avenue. Make a Left onto St. Paul's Blvd. Next Right onto Plume Street. Hotel is on the Right.

From Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport

Go out North on Bland Blvd. Turn Left toward Garage Parking. Stay Straight to go onto Bland Blvd. Turn Left onto Jefferson Ave/VA-143 E. Merge onto I-64 E toward Hampton/Norfolk. Merge onto VA-168 S via Exit 277 A. VA-168 S becomes Tidewater Dr/VA-337 W. Stay Straight to go onto E City Hall Ave. Turn Left onto St. Paul's Blvd. Turn Right onto E Plume St. End at Courtyard, 520 E Plume St Norfolk Va 23510 (hotel is on the right.)
