

In 1985, Mordechai Vanunu shot two rolls of film that exposed Israel's clandestine seven story underground Weapons of Mass Destruction Facility in the Negev. Vanunu was released from 18 years in Ashkelon prison on April 21, 2004 under draconian restrictions that denied him the right to freedom of speech and to leave Israel.





American author and human rights activist, Eileen Fleming became a reporter after she met Vanunu in June 2005, during her first of seven trips to Israel Palestine. When Vanunu's historic and underreported Freedom of Speech Trial began on January 25, 2006, she became a 21st century muckraker.


