Living Skills are those skills associated with food preparation, household chores, laundry, personal hygiene, safety, healthcare and purchasing food and toiletries.

Social Integration Skills involve interactive conversations, making appropriate decisions, dating and sexuality, and engaging in social and recreational activities.

Vocational Skills are those skills focused on preparing for employment, obtaining employment and maintaining a job.

MODULE 1 - LIVING SKILLS:

In Vista's Living Skills module, young adults learn to live independently with minimal assistance, learning skills like:

- Preparing food and cooking meals
- Managing time effectively
- Maintaining a budget and paying bills
- Completing personal hygiene and grooming tasks
- Following laws, rules and guidelines and engaging in safe behavior
- Purchasing food, toiletries, and other household items

MODULE 2 - SOCIAL INTEGRATION SKILLS:

In Vista's Social Integration Skills module, young adults learn to participate more fully in relationships, with skills like:

- Initiating and maintaining personal relationships
- Using appropriate social etiquette and table manners
- Tolerating frustration and exhibiting calming strategies
- Participating in social, recreational, and leisure activities
- Expressing & regulating emotions
- Using public transportation and restrooms

MODULE 3 - VOCATIONAL SKILLS:

In Vista's Vocational Skills Module, young adults prepare for employment, with skills like:

- Developing a resume
- Completing job applications
- Answering interview questions and interacting with recruiters
- Planning and executing tasks
- Presenting themselves professionally
- Managing job stress
