

COTTON FUN FACTS

- In the 2011 crop year, U.S. cotton growers produced an estimated 18 million (480-lb) bales on 11 million acres.
- American paper currency is made of 75% cotton.
- The first light bulb manufactured by Thomas Edison used cotton filament.
- Cotton is good for all seasons because it keeps the body cool in the summer and warm in the winter.
- The average American owns seven pairs of blue jeans.
- There are 150 yards of cotton in a regulation baseball.
- In 1730, cotton was first spun by machinery thanks to the Industrial Revolution.
- Eli Whitney invented the cotton gin during the Industrial Revolution allowing cotton growers to supply larger amounts of cotton fiber each year to the growing textile industry and changing the face of the cotton industry forever.
- One bale of cotton weighs about 480 pounds, and there are approximately four bales in a ton of cotton.
