# DDC clinic

## Center for Special Needs Children

*Our mission is to enhance the quality of life for people with special needs caused by rare genetic disorders.*

DDC Clinic ~ Center for Special Needs Children is a non-profit primary care and research facility serving patients with complex medical needs. We were established to help children with rare genetic disorders – disorders that are difficult and time-consuming to diagnose and treat. DDC Clinic is located about 45 minutes east of Cleveland in Middlefield, Ohio. The population we serve is mostly under-insured and underserved. No child is turned away from care at DDC Clinic based on ability to pay.

Immediate diagnosis and treatment is critical to saving lives, and preventing further debilitating effects for children with special needs caused by rare genetic disorders. **Many patients with genetic disorders we diagnose can have their symptoms reduced and at times entirely alleviated with prompt treatment** - the earlier the diagnosis, the better the outcome.

### *The DDC Clinic Difference:*

Today DDC Clinic's medical services concentrate on three critical areas:

- **Comprehensive Patient Care**
- **Patient Oriented Research**
- **Multifaceted Education**

Recognized by peers in medicine, DDC Clinic's research team's work has been in over **twenty publications**, including highly respected medical journals like: *Science, Nature Genetics, The Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences of the United States of America (PNAS), Clinical Genetics, and Progress in Pediatric Cardiology*. DDC Clinic has received recognition awards from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, American Academy of Pediatrics Special Achievement Award, the Johnson & Johnson Community.

# Race Program



## General Rules

### Straight Race Wagering

When placing a wager to win, simply go to the window with the number matching the horse you wish to bet on.

Straight race wagering will be “win” only. There will be no place or show betting.

Minimum wager will be \$2.00. You will receive one ticket for each \$2.00 you wager.

### Special Race Wagering

Go to the designated window and tell the ticket seller the combinations you wish to wager.

Minimum wagers will be \$2.00. You will receive one ticket for each \$2.00 you wager.

#### *Daily Double Races*

The daily double consists of two consecutive races. The object of the daily double is to pick the winner of each consecutive race. You may only bet the daily double in the 1st half of the daily double races.

#### *Perfecta Races*

The object of the perfecta is to select in order, the first and second place horse in the designated perfecta race.

#### *Trifecta Races*

The object of the trifecta is to select in order, the first, second and third place horse in the designated trifecta race.

### No Pre-Race Betting

You cannot place wagers for future races. All wagering is done for the upcoming race.

If you wish to wager on multiple horses in any race you must go to the designated horse’s window to bet.

### How to Collect Your Winnings

Please take your winning ticket to the CASH WINDOW after each race.

\*\*Cashiers have the right to refuse to cash any ticket damaged or altered in any way. We cannot be responsible for tickets that are purchased and lost.

### Auction Race

The Auctioneer will sell all the horses “auction” style with the high bidder for each horse being the eventual owner. The winning horse owner will receive 50% of the total amount taken in from the sale price of all 10 horses. The remainder goes to DDC Clinic to continue their pioneering work.

The odds are 1 in 10 that you could possibly win 5 times your initial investment. You can bid individually or your table can pool money and purchase a horse. You will also win at the betting windows as well. A great chance—with great odds—to have some fun, win BIG BUCK\$ and support DDC Clinic too!!

## *General Auction Rules*

1. Values are estimated; not warranted for tax purposes or general value.
2. Purchasers are bound by the restrictions set by the donors. All sales are final, and there are no exchanges or refunds of items, unless otherwise specified.
3. The Patchwork Auction Committee has done its best to describe items accurately. Catalog descriptions are for convenience only. DDC Clinic Patchwork Committee and Board of Directors will not be responsible for errors in descriptions, authenticity or conditions of goods auctioned.
4. Everything is offered and sold in AS IS condition.
5. Payment by the successful bidder may be made as soon as cashiers are open. You may pay by cash, check (payable to DDC Clinic), MasterCard or Visa.  
PAYMENT IN FULL THIS EVENING IS MANDATORY.
6. Each guest/couple has a bid number registered for their use on all bidding.
7. Unless otherwise specified, all live and silent auction items and services must be used within one year after May 5, 2012.
8. Items may be claimed only by exhibiting a PAID receipt. All items are to be removed from the premises by the close of the evening unless an item is unusually large. Arrangements for pick-up of large items must be made this evening with staff at check-out.
9. The CASHIERS will open 30 minutes after the close of the Night at the Races! ANY OF THE CASHIERS WILL BE ABLE TO HANDLE YOUR TRANSACTIONS.

## *Silent Auction Rules*

1. All items in the silent auction have bid sheets located on or affixed near the item. Persons desiring to bid must do so by writing on the bid sheet their bidding number and the amount bid.
2. EACH INCREASE IN BID MUST EQUAL OR EXCEED THE MINIMUM INCREASE FIGURE STATED ON THE BID SHEET IN ORDER TO CONSTITUTE A VALID BID.
3. Invalid bids (bids not following the minimum increase) will be struck out by a DDC Clinic official and do not constitute a valid bid. The bid above the struck out invalid bid becomes the valid bid at that time. If the auction area has not closed, additional increased bids are to be based on the current valid bid.
4. Each new bid must be written on the topmost blank line available on the bid sheet. Should a second bid sheet be put into use on an item, the first bid sheet will be crossed out, but will remain on the table.  
UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES MAY THE BID SHEET BE REMOVED FROM THE BIDDING TABLE.
5. The silent auction will have various closing times. These times will be announced during the Night at the Races! The closing bid circled by the DDC Clinic official constitutes the winning bid.
6. In the event of a dispute, a DDC Clinic official will act as the final authority and shall determine the winning bidder. His/her decision will be final.
7. All sales are final and there will be no exchanges or refunds on items except where specified.

## *Payment Procedure*

**Please do not collect any items until you have received your payment receipts.**

1. The checkout area will be located in the atrium close to where you checked in.
2. Payment will be sorted by bid number. Cash, check and major credit cards may be used for payment.
3. You will receive a receipt and copies of item bid tickets.
4. Turn in your bid tickets at the table in the atrium marked "Pick Up Your Items Here." Runners will collect your items and bring them to you.
5. Please exit Landerhaven through the front door to the valet attendants.
