

BIOGRAPHY | Antonia Felix

Author, educator, scholar and musician, Antonia Felix is a remarkable Renaissance woman with a record of success in each of her professional fields. As the *New York Times* bestselling author of fifteen nonfiction books, she has made her mark as a biographer with:

As the first biographer of Justice Sotomayor, Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice, former New Jersey Gov. Christie Todd Whitman, and First Lady Laura Bush, she has spoken and lectured frequently on women in politics and appeared on TV / radio including CNN, MSNBC, FoxNews, SkyNews, CNN International, NPR, BBC, C-Span, SiriusXM, PBS's "Washington Journal," "Entertainment Tonight" and "Inside Edition."

She was featured in the award-winning 2010 documentary *American Faust: From Condi to Neo-Condi*. Her international women's rights research led to activities as the moderator of a U.S. Senate briefing on policy options toward Iran and as a panelist in a U.S. House of Representatives caucus on women and democracy.

Public Speaker and Musical Background

Antonia's public speaking appearances have included the Robert Dole Institute of Politics, Columbia-Montour Women's Conference, the Ozark and Tallgrass Creative Writing workshops and Iowa Book Festival. In addition to speaking about the craft of writing, Antonia presents a workshop on dreams and creativity for writers and artists based on her decades of experience with Jungian dream analysis.

The author's biographies profiling Andrea Bocelli, Harry Connick, Jr., and musical savant Tony Deblois reflect her professional background in music as an operatic soprano who has performed in concert and recital and conducted masterclasses throughout the United States and Europe, including Paris, Moscow and Prague. Antonia studied music at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, the Mannes College of Music in New York City and the Institute of Advanced Vocal Studies in Paris.

Antonia received an M.F.A. in Creative Writing (Fiction) at Wichita State University and holds an M.A. in English from Texas A&M University-Kingsville and B.A. in Psychology from Metropolitan State University (St. Paul, MN). She is an adjunct professor in the Graduate School of Liberal Studies at Hamline University in St. Paul, Minnesota, and lives with her husband in Minneapolis.
