Delaware Sports Medicine Surgeon, Michael J. Axe, MD Receives AOSSM's Highest Award

He also completed another orthopaedic trauma fellowship at Harborview Hospital in Seattle in 1985.

He currently serves as the Director for the All Sports Clinic of Delaware at First State Orthopaedics, where he is also a founding partner. Dr. Axe also has many roles at the University of Delaware, including clinical professor, medical director for the University of Delaware Sports Physical Therapy Residency Program and staff member for the Center for Biomedical Engineering Research. In addition, he is an active member of the teaching staff at the Medical Center of Delaware.

Dr. Axe enjoys serving and leading his local community and has been a medical director or consultant for numerous professional, college and high school teams in the area and volunteers with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Delaware.

During his more than 30 years in orthopaedics, Dr. Axe has received numerous awards, including:
