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OFFICIALS FROM 20 COUNTRIES TO RECEIVE TRAINING IN BATTLE CREEK

BATTLE CREEK, Mich., Jul. 17- Food protection officials from 20 countries will meet July 24 at the International Food Protection Training Institute to discuss effective food safety training within a globally integrated food system. The group's visit to The Training Institute — the global leader in developing and delivering career-spanning training for food safety professionals — is part of the annual "International Food Safety Short Course" sponsored by Michigan State University (MSU) and will include presentations by Gerald Wojtala, executive director of The Institute.

"Food safety is an issue that affects everyone on the planet, and making sure that the food supply is safe should be a top priority for all countries," said Wojtala.
