



USO Travis Air Force Base

- USO Travis re-opened in a new location on August 1st 2012. (Previous center was established in May 1984.)
- Formerly located in the Terminal Building on the flight line at Travis Air Force Base in northern California, USO Travis is now located at the Travis Conference Center.
- The new location puts USO Travis AFB closer to young Airmen living in dormitories and military families staying in temporary living facilities. USO Travis relocated in order to better serve the Travis AFB military community.
- Population Served: USO Travis will serve the more than 10,000 active duty service men and women and almost 9,000 family members of Travis Air Force Base.
- Compared to the old space which was 1,320 square feet, the new USO Travis is 2,860 square feet.
- USO Travis will provide signature USO programs and services to troops and their families such as Internet connectivity, laptops, television, telephones, snacks and beverages, as well as gaming stations, ping pong and pool table. The new center will also now offer United Through Reading's Military Program, allowing service men and women to record themselves reading a story to their children or other family members. No "dough" dinners (free meals), as well as arts and crafts will be provided.
