It was 25 years ago that music professor Dennis Plies placed an order for a marimba and moved Ron Samuels to quit his woodworking job and jump into building marimbas full time.

This summer, Dennis felt that his 25-year-old marimba could benefit from an overall upgrade. So he and his wife Barbara came to our shop in Arcata, California, with their beloved instrument.

The craftsmen at *marimba one*® upgraded his frame, refitted the instrument with all-new hardward, retuned the keyboard and the resonators. They did it according to the same motto that Ron gave to Plies when he took his original order: "perseverance and honest workmanship."

Plies acknowledged Ron's expertise, saying, ""You have altered the percussion world worldwide... I feel famous with the original model."

While the bars on his marimba had maintained their

Basso Bravo® resonator voicing

Our pioneering work on resonator acoustics means that we have won approval for a patent to be issued soon—for the creation of Basso Bravo[®] resonator voicing.

We have also developed harmonic filters for our resonators--a first for marimbas.

The sound of Basso Bravo[®] resonator voicing is truly the sound we have always dreamed of for the bass end of the marimba.

Here is how it sounds: If you

imagine a graphic equalizer for a stereo system where you turn up the volume on the fundamental of the marimba's bass end and turn down the volume on the overtones that are present in both the bass resonators and bars, this is the sound of Basso Bravo[®] voicing. It is a distinctly warmer, darker, and louder bass sound.

We pinpoint specific harmonics in the resonators that we feel detracts from the warm round sound we are looking for. We then build into the resonator the harmonic filter to reinforce the *marimba one*® sound we are looking to create.

Our patented process allows us to engineer the specific harmonic content of each Basso Bravo[®] resonator so that the timbre of all the resonators is the same.

Brian: The Master Tuner

Brian, the Master Tuner at marimba one®, says that what you need to bring bars to a correct pitch is "a good ear

and good hands." For this master tuner, the strobe tuners are the necessary quantifier, but the ear is the qualifier. He ought to know since he has tuned well over 100,000 bars in the last decade.

The Seattle native started as a woodworker and landscaper and went to luthier school in Phoenix so that he could discover how to build guitars. But he found his true calling when he arrived in Arcata ("I knew I was home," he says) and was trained to tune at *marimba one*® by founder-owner Ron Samuels.

Marimba tuners are a rare and precious breed. "There's not a lot written about tuning, so I essentially learned by ear to mix and match the bars to create a uniform sound across the keyboard," Brian says.

After more than a decade of tuning marimba keyboards, Brian's expertise has no equal. He and his support staff do everything from determining which pieces of rosewood in their raw form will be selected to become concert quality marimba bars, to drilling and shaping the bars, and to the tuning of the bars. Each bar is individually hand tuned. At *marimba one*®, tuners match the resonance and harmonic character and overall timbre of each bar to its neighboring bars, drawing from an inventory of over 100 sets of keyboards. The result is that every keyboard sounds and feels as if it's from a single piece of wood.

"I love the challenge of it," says Brian. "Every piece of wood is unique, and so it is sometimes frustrating but always interesting."


