Parent and filmmaker Paul Zehrer was motivated upon seeing how his son's school was struggling to communicate with parents. "My goal was to help prevent families from leaving and reach out to new prospective parents. I wanted to help the school effectively communicate their 'story' - as a school, and "why" Waldorf is so relevant and important to the 21st Century." Zehrer teamed up with another parent at the school, Corte Madera documentary filmmaker Chikara Motomura to make a film that would give parents a better understanding of why Waldorf works.

The film drew over 40,000 viewers from around the world on Youtube and is credited with contributing to a 10% increase in enrollment, a 26% increase in the number of school donors, and an annual fund at its all-time high. The film has gone on to win a 2012 Golden Cine Award, 2012 Silver Telly Award, and featured in the 2012 Santa Rosa Film Festival.
