


What is Excel By 5?

- Excel By 5 is a certification whereby communities can be formally recognized for their progress to support young children 0-5 and their families.
- Children in Excel By 5 communities will be healthy and prepared for kindergarten and first grade.

And, it is much more...

Excel By 5:

- identifies gaps in community resources,
- promotes community collaboration and volunteerism,
- promotes economic development,
- relies on existing best practices.



Why Focus on the Early Years?

- At birth, the brain is ¼ of its future adult size.
- By year 1, it is ¾ of its adult size.
- By age three the child's brain is 2½ times more active than the brains of adults.
- Experiences in the first three years contribute significantly to the structure of the brain.
- The window of opportunity for making brain connections largely closes by about age 5. If they didn't form by then, they may never form.

A Child's experiences in the first months and years of life determine whether he or she will enter school eager to learn or not.

By school age, **family and caregivers** have already prepared the child for success or failure. The **community** has already helped or hindered the family's capacity to nurture the child's development.
