**Vendor and model proliferation** Multiple service providers and business models

**Large span of functions** Typically combination of many IT, BPO and some KPO services

**Increasing scope** Significant proportion of operations now in low cost locations

**Global delivery chain** Services often delivered from multiple locations with diverse risk footprint

**Dynamic economies** Most delivery locations are emerging economies going through rapid change

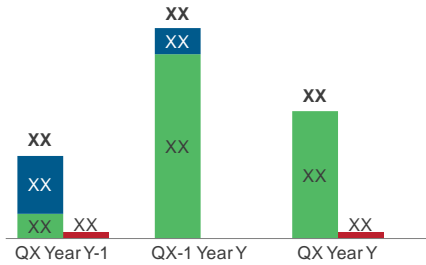

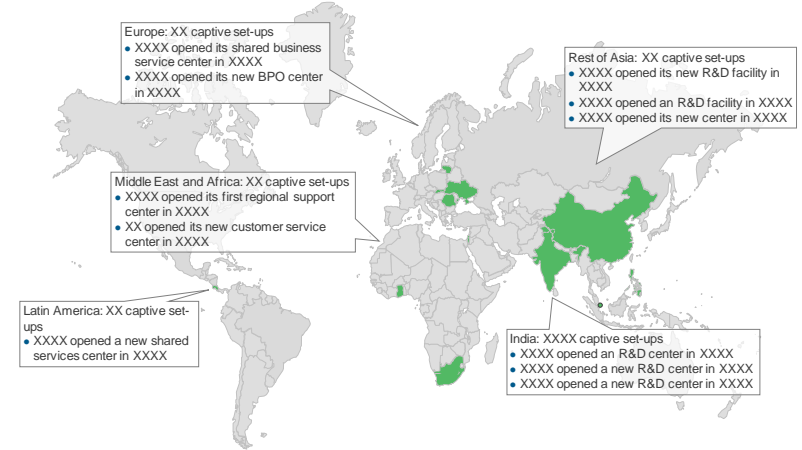

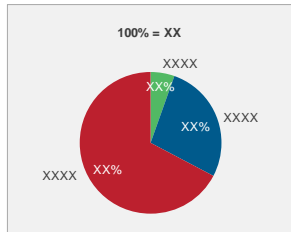

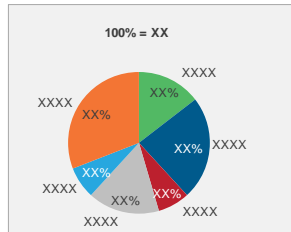

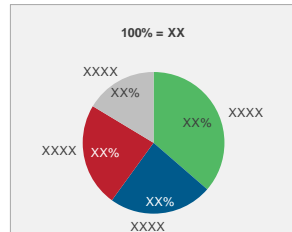

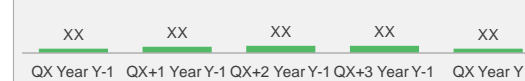

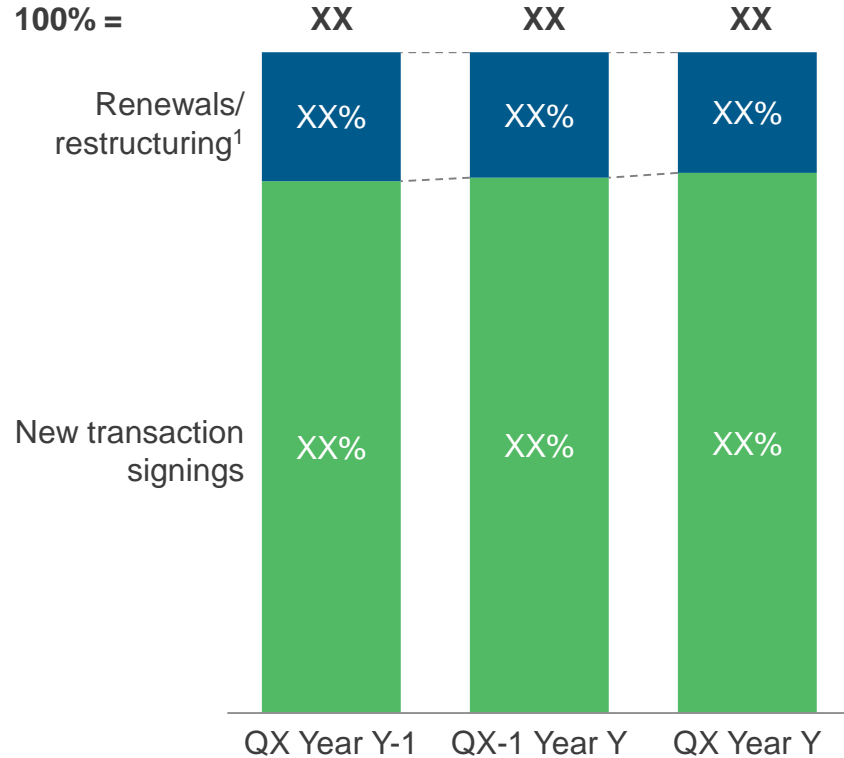

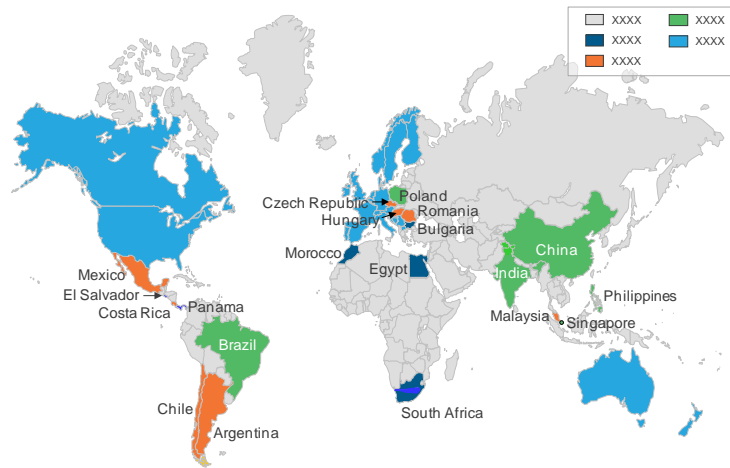

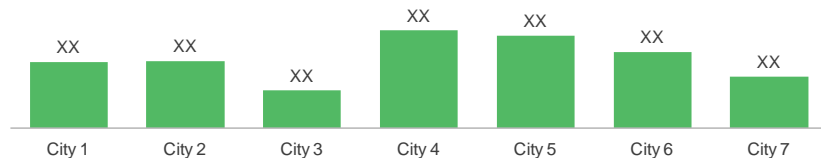

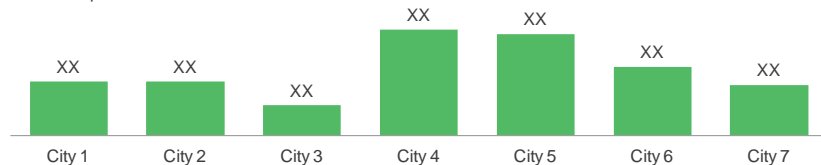

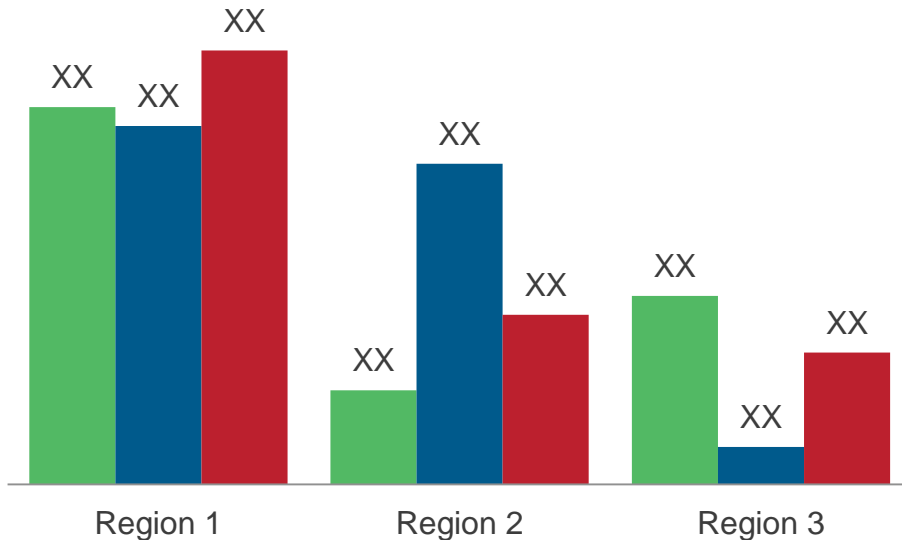

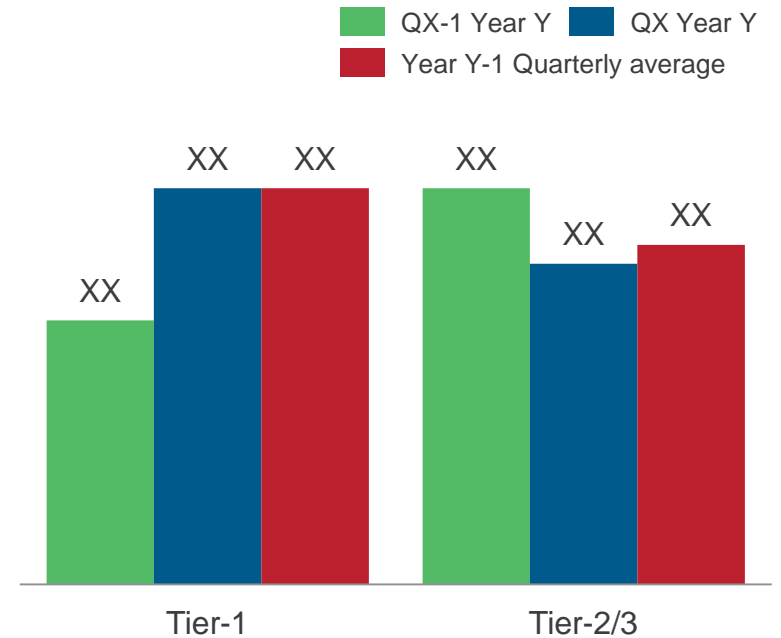
## Market activity across geographies

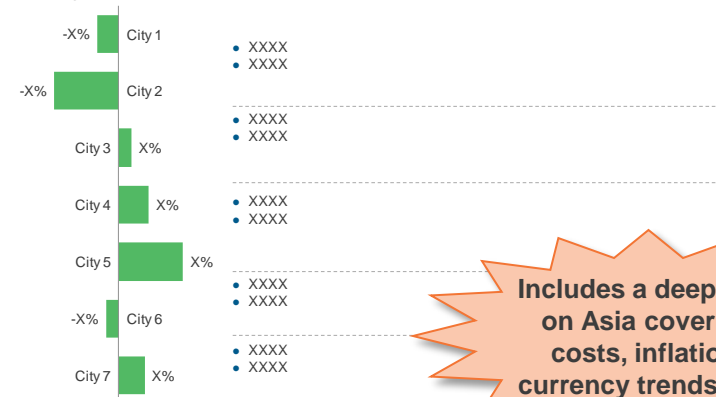

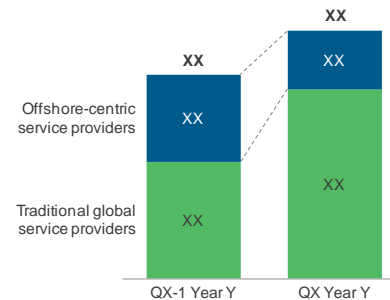

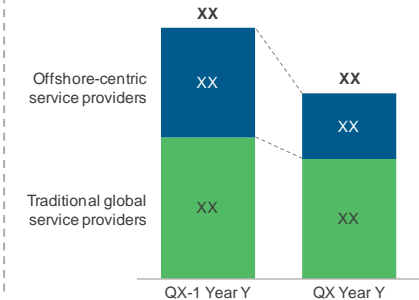

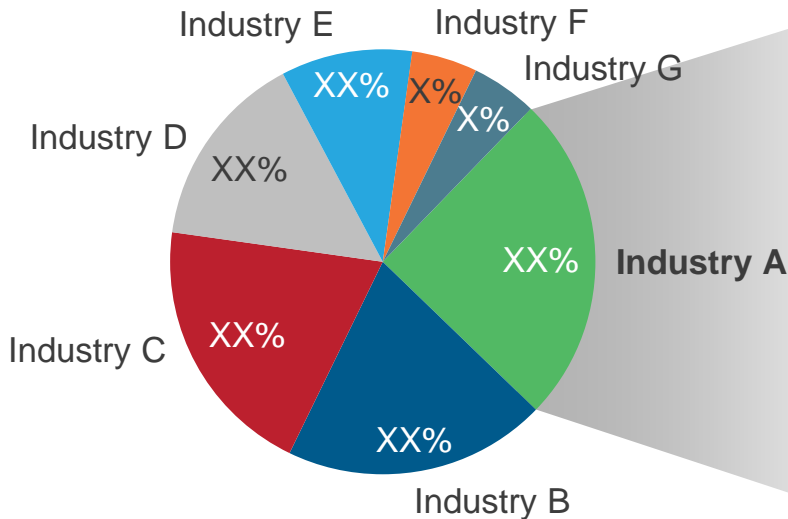

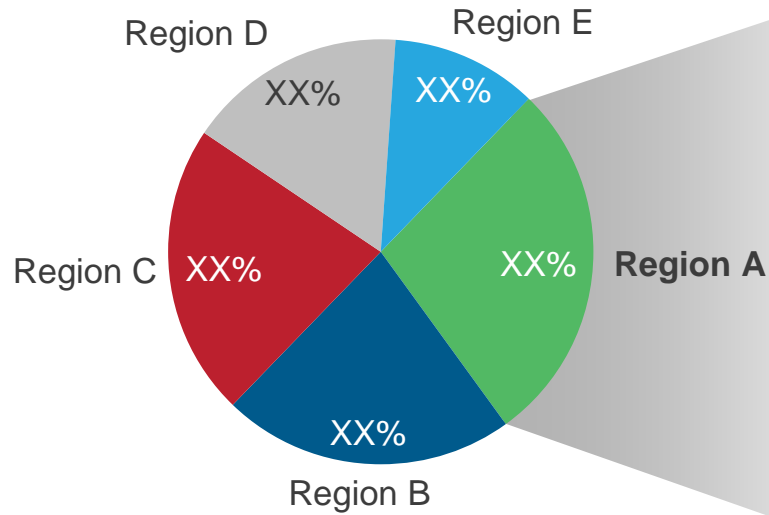
