RHEUMATOLOGY NURSING OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZED AS A NURSING SPECIALTY

Lutherville, MD (PRWEB) November 10, 2012 -- On November 9th, 2012 the American Nurses Association Board of Directors announced its recognition of rheumatology nursing as a nursing specialty, approval of the rheumatology nursing scope of practice statement, and acknowledgment of the standards of practice for rheumatology Registered Nurses (RNs) and Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs) in rheumatology.

Rheumatology Nurses Society (RNS) developed and submitted to the American Nursing Association a request for recognition of rheumatology nursing as a specialty. Publishing of the official rheumatology nursing scope and standards of practice will be forthcoming.
